I wanted to follow up on my last article about CW (Continuous Wave) and Morse code by addressing some questions I received. One of the most common inquiries is: Where do you start to learn Morse code?

Fortunately, there are many excellent resources available, both free and paid. Personally, I've tried various methods over the years, from cassette tapes (back when I first learned in 1999) to several apps on my iPhone. If you missed my previous article, I initially learned CW for my General license but didn't use it afterward, which led me to forget most of it.

To begin learning Morse code, it's essential to familiarize yourself with the individual letters and numbers. A useful free app for this purpose is **Morse Machine**, which is available on the iPhone. Additionally, I extensively used **Learn CW Online (LCWO)**, a free web-based platform that requires just a simple account sign-up.

I also became a member of the **Long Island CW Club**, which offers Zoom classes. Although I didn't utilize their resources as much as I could have, it's a fantastic club. They provide classes for all skill levels, from complete beginners to those looking to master 20+ words per minute. The annual membership fee is \$30, which is well worth it given the numerous classes available each week. You can check out their offerings at <u>longislandcwclub.org</u>.

Now, let's discuss the best way to learn Morse code. There really isn't a one-size-fits-all approach. You need to discover what works best for you, and the only way to do that is by diving in. I recommend starting with a simple app on your phone or using LCWO, which feels more like a game than a traditional class.

Here are a couple of suggestions I wish I had followed:

**Use Farnsworth spacing** — Practice listening at a letter speed of 20 WPM while spacing the letters much slower, around 5 WPM. This ensures that you recognize the sound of the letter rather than hearing the dots and dashes. Trying to memorize the dots and dashes for each character will only slow you down later when you try to speed up. You must learn the sound of the character.

**Dedicate time each day** — I suggest setting aside at least 15 to 20 minutes each day for copying code. I didn't do this initially, which made it take much longer to learn the letters, numbers, and punctuation than it should have. Consistent daily practice is crucial; it certainly was for me. Don't go too long either. A one-hour marathon session will not be as productive as four 15-minute sessions. But again, whatever works best for you.

Happy learning, and I hope you find these tips helpful on your Morse code journey!
