





# Why Parks on the Air

Hello CFARS, I was recently on a trip to visit relatives in Erie PA and got the chance to activate some parks. If you've ever wanted to combine your love of nature with the thrill of amateur radio, then **Parks on the Air (POTA)** is your perfect invitation. Designed to engage radio operators around the globe, POTA encourages licensed amateurs to set up portable stations in parks, preserves, and public lands, turning natural settings into vibrant communication hubs.

## A Signal from the Wild

Launched to promote both outdoor operating and emergency preparedness, POTA has become a favorite among hams who enjoy field operations. The concept is simple: "activators" head into designated parks and attempt to make at least 10 contacts in one UTC day, while "hunters" tune in from their shacks or mobile rigs to log those activations. The program isn't just about logging QSOs. It's about building community, testing gear in diverse environments, and exploring the synergy between radio science and the great outdoors.

#### What You'll Need to Join the Fun

Most activators travel light, relying on compact HF radios, antennas like end-fed wires or verticals, and battery power. Parks range from towering national forests to quiet county preserves—each presenting its own terrain challenges and RF quirks. Flexibility is key, and creativity thrives. Activations don't require fancy setups. A folding table, a dipole between trees, and a charged-up rig can bring the world to you.

#### **Awards & Recognition**

Both activators and hunters earn awards for participation, including:

**Certificates for contact milestones** 

Badges for activating new parks

Special event challengesthroughout the year

POTA's online portal offers real-time spotting, logging, and award tracking to keep the experience dynamic and motivating. Check out the spot pages on a weekend and you'll see an abundance of activity. Visit <a href="https://pota.app/#/">https://pota.app/#/</a> for more information.

#### A Global Movement

Though born in North America, POTA has blossomed into a global program with participants spanning Europe, Asia, South America, and beyond. Radio amateurs are leveraging this platform to promote environmental awareness, accessibility, and global goodwill—all over the airwaves.

If you are interested in getting into the parks on the air program you can start by being a hunter. Check the spot pages and see if you can work those activators and win some awards. #### EMCOMM/ EOC/ AUXCOM

The clubs work in AUXCOM is moving along great. We have 20 members signed up as of now and have completed most of their training. Thank you for that. We had a great class on Web EOC and that site has a ton of information on it and Amanda did outstanding on the instructions. The EOC staff have been great to work with, and I thank them for welcoming us to help.

I have stepped up to be the head for AUXCOM in Cumberland County. This was lacking for our area. We are attached to the south eastern part of the 33 counties area. With Kinston being the center.

A lot of us did our first training through the EOC in a drill that centered around a 7.4 earthquake. We had to send messages and Win Link email as part of this drill. This drill did not push our team much just because of the distance from the event. I plan on having another drill for the team in OCT.

Things we need to work on. First is learning how to and setting up Win Link in your home and at the shelter if needed. KD4B is setting up a Win link repeater for us to use local as well. Having Win links at the Shelters and at the EOC is a game changer and it is what the EOC is going to use. I plan on having some classes for the Team this month. We will mainly use Telnet if the internet is up and running. If the Internet is down, then we will need to be able to send Win Link by HF radio. It is not that hard. I suggest that you send a weekly Win link message to keep the skill set up and running.
