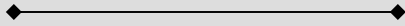

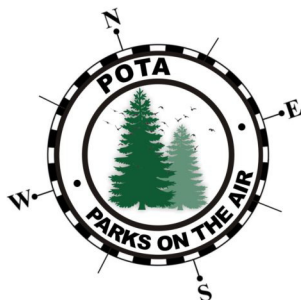

AUXCOMM / EOC - 2025 Year in Review

As we begin a new year, the Emergency Management Office would like to recognize the continued dedication and progress of the partnership we have with Cape Fear Amateur Radio Society (CFARS). Throughout 2025, CFARS played a key role in strengthening emergency communications readiness and supporting countywide preparedness efforts. CFARS remains a vital component of Cumberland County's emergency management framework, providing redundancy, resilience, and technical expertise when it matters most.

2025 Highlights

Planning & Program Development

- Conducted multiple communications tests and exercises to validate redundant emergency communications capabilities.
- Recently met to review and discuss a draft CFARS Standard Operating Procedure (SOP), advancing clearer roles, activation processes, and expectations.
- Continued integration of CFARS planning into shelter operations, exercises, and broader Emergency Management planning efforts.

Equipment & Infrastructure Improvements

- Held discussions with MCA regarding the installation of coaxial cabling, supporting improved connectivity and system reliability.
- Completed the purchase of new equipment, expanding operational communications capability.
- Updated and tested radio and communications equipment at shelter locations, supporting shelter readiness.
- Conducted inventories and equipment reviews to ensure accountability and operational readiness.

Training, Testing & Coordination

- Supported and participated in communications tests throughout the year to validate systems, procedures, and interoperability.
- Assisted with WebEOC exercises and EOC-related activities, reinforcing coordination between communications and situational awareness.
- Supported Disaster Communications Week, highlighting the importance of interoperable and redundant communications.

Partnerships & Engagement

- Strengthened coordination between CFARS, Emergency Management, and surrounding county partners.
- Continued collaboration with regional, state, and local stakeholders to support a whole-community approach to emergency communications.
