

# July 2019 Club Meeting Minutes

On July 17th the Cape Fear Amateur Radio Society meeting was held in Room of the Keith Allison Building at Methodist University, Fayetteville, North Carolina at 7:30pm. President **David KR40E** opened the meeting and welcomed all for coming. **David KR40E** led the *Pledge of Allegiance to our Flag.* **Pete K4QFK** led the invocation. **David KR40E** led the introductions in the usual CFARS manner.

A motion was made by **Marty W4MLW**, seconded by **Ed N4ESA**, to approve the minutes of the June meeting with the call of **George KM4ODS** corrected. By vote the motion carried.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Treasurer: Chuck KJ4RV gave the Treasurer's report and apparently we haven't spent all

of it.

Repeater: Ben KM4ODT gave his report on the repeaters. The 146.91 repeater is down, waiting for the trip to Highsmith-Rainey after some TLC to the equipment and the new tower and antenna. All net business has been being had on the 147.33 repeater at the Soldier Support Center on Fort Bragg. Many of the members have been having issues in hitting that particular repeater. The 6m repeater is not up yet. The 444.400 repeater is up in its new location and is doing fine business. Mike K4JWX reported that the tower removal project was under way, the antennae have been removed along with all the coax, two sections have been removed thus far, the crane was not able to get into position to remove the tower, therefore it is being removed manually by climbing the tower. This will be an ongoing project due to the heat. Marty W4MLW said that all business was being conducted on the 147.33 repeater, many users have been having issues getting into the repeater and move that net business be moved to the 444.4 repeater, these being the Possum Trot net in the morning and the evening net, until the 146.91 repeater is returned to normal operating status. Carl K4CFB seconded the motion. There was some discussion. This was put to a vote and was approved by the members present.

**Net Manager: Chuck KJ4RV** the net check-ins and times were about the sam as last month. Let's keep them busy.

**Health & Welfare: Carl K4CFB** gave the report on Health and Welfare. **Ron K4FET** had been hospitalized and they turned him loose. He is still in Yankee country caring for a friend of his. **David KR4OE** asked him to send a card to the family of **Donnie Smith AD4TL** (SK) a long-time member of the club.

# CFARS Tower Removal

As you all know CFARS has had our repeater located on the Campus of Methodist University for many many years. Countless hams have used our repeaters over the years. A few months back we were informed by Methodist University the tower needed to come down. The issue was the guy wires were not secure. We were unable to replace the guy wires due to either needing to tie them into the roof structure of the Hendricks Science building or have raised anchor points with lots of concrete.

So the university decided the tower must be removed. What was CFARS to do? Where would we relocate our repeaters? Through the tower removal and reinstallation committee a replacement location was found. The repeaters have been removed at this point in time.

Over the period of July 15 through 24 our tower was taken down. As with all things there were other things going on. The university scheduled an asbestos removal from the Hendricks Science building. So the tower crew had to use ladders to gain roof access Temporary guys were attached to the tower during the times they were working. At the end of the day the temporary guys were removed so that no one would walk into them. The next day the temporary guys were replaced. As the tower came down, the temporary guys were moved down the tower. This was a slow tedious process but was required for safety of the tower crew/ The temperatures during this time were extremely hot with the usual North Carolina humidity. The tower crew worked tirelessly to finish up this job.

The Hendricks Science building doesn't look the same without the tower. But as all good things must do, they come to an end. CFARS appreciates all the years Methodist University allowed us to have a home for our tower. We will continue to meet at the university for club meetings and VE testing. Alan Pier and his crew were great to work with.


