The President's Corner: David KI4W

I guess that is what it is like to be a dx station and have the whole world calling you. I mainly worked 40 and 80 meters with 40 yielding the most contacts. I would have loved to work 20 but my antenna was not very efficient on that band however I did have a couple of good runs on Sunday morning on 10 and 15 meters and ended up with 440 cw contacts. I can't wait until next year. If you operated Field Day get those logs in so CFARS will get credit for them.

I think everyone enjoyed being together again and were rather pleased with the meeting location however we could have done without the rain. For July we will again meet at Peace Presbyterian Church. As you know by now the CFARS Swapfest in August has been cancelled. That was a painful decision but given the state of affairs it was the right decision. This would have been our 22nd year so number 22 will have to wait until next year. I have been asked about alternatives to the Swapfest. One idea would be to have a Traders Net one night on our repeater or to list items on our Facebook page. Other options are the monthly newsletter or email your items to our newsletter editor and let him compile the list and email them out. This works well for one of the national qrp cw groups which some of us are members. We will talk about it at the meeting so let's hear your input.

Since the last meeting CFARS lost one of our most active members on the hf bands. We lost Gene Tyree N4ANV who was the best ssb operator I have seen operate. There was always a friendly rivalry between the cw station and ssb station at Field Day. When Gene showed up the qso count at the ssb station skyrocketed. Gene could run a hundred contacts an hour with no problem. It was a treat just to sit back and watch him operate. Gene was also an avid dxer with a country count well over 300 and he had pretty much worked all the countries in the world. Additionally Gene was very active with the county hunters and was a member of the Mobile Amateur Radio Awards Club(MARAC). Gene has worked every county in the United States if memory serves me correct three times over. If that weren't enough Gene had also transmitted from just about county in the United States. I worked Gene all around the country and I thought that was pretty neat. Gene was also active in the Ten Ten ssb contests however there was one particular Ten Ten CW Contest back around 1994 or so give or take a year and Gene wanted to work a cw contest. Gene ordered an AEA Morse Machine Three. If you are familiar with these this is one of the best or maybe the best memory keyer ever made. They are no longer made and are highly coveted.
