If you give a mouse a cookie...

I thought I was getting licensed so I could use good, cost effective radio communication while backpacking and hiking alone with my 3 kids. I didn't look one step farther into the hobby.

On January 11, 2020 I shook hands with another testee, Kevin (KO4BEP), passed my Tech, upgraded to General, and had a small crew of enthusiastic VEs convince me that I needed to explore the hobby a little more. "Your kids will really love it" they said.

Kevin and I became quick friends. He has dabbled in radio and electronics for years, so he was all in once he passed his exam. It doesn't take much to convince me to meet new people and be excited with them, so I was more than happy to dive all in too. On January 18

he came over and helped me drill a hole in the roof of my car for an NMO antenna, and run the coax through so beautifully that my husband still has no idea how the wire got from my roof to my handheld. On January 20 we went to the CFARS meeting and Burt handed both of us a business card and said he could get us a radio for our houses and to contact him. January 21 the FCC issued Kevin and me call signs, and we were on the local repeater immediately.

The next week Burt, Ed, and Bob came to my house. I assumed they were going to drop off a radio and let me know what kind of antenna to start working toward getting. Boy was I in for a surprise. By the end of a really lovely afternoon, I had the CFARS club Kenwood TS 130S, a power supply and a dipole antenna strung across two trees in my yard. The next day I went to see Burt's ham shack, and my oldest son walked away with a small soldering kit. He made a joule thief, and has been proudly bringing it **everywhere**. Our next project is going to be a small CW light in a mint tin.

So far I've worked a handful of states on HF, found two YL nets on Echolink, made time to get on the CFARS 7pm net most nights, talked to hams all the way up I-95 (and incidentally managed to meet one of CFARS' former presidents), worked Italy, and heard people from all

over the world. My husband heard the radio once, and within 24 hours got me noise cancelling headphones so that the radio wouldn't interrupt his shows... err... so that I could hear better... that's what it was...

I have no background in electronics or radios, so the two major things I want to do for now are to keep listening, and to build. Antennas, maybe radios, small projects, anything I can build to try to help myself understand the systems a little better.

I got my amateur radio license because I thought it was absurd to spend \$350 on a satellite communication device. Joke's on me, huh?
