The President's Corner: David KI4W

It is with a heavy heart as I compose this Presidents Message. On April 26 we lost our good friend and CFARS Life Member Bill Kelchner KU4W. The one remark that was repeated often was that when you met Bill you liked him. I can certainly attest to that. Bill was the first amateur radio operator I met when I decided I wanted to become a ham. There was a recorded message on the repeater about a VE Test Session being held on Fort Bragg and Bill was the contact person and it gave his phone number as a point of contact. I did not own a radio at that time but I would monitor the repeaters with a scanner.

I told Bill during that first conversation I was not ready to test at that time but I would be ready by the time the next exam session rolled around. Bill asked for my phone number and told me he would call me as soon as he knew the date of the next test session and for me to call him if I had any questions.

I did call when I needed clarification on some things and during those conversations I learned that I had graduated from high school with Bill's daughter(more on that later) and that he had worked with my uncle at the phone company. I get a call from Bill one morning and Bill gives me the date of the test session which was about two weeks away. The plan was to meet at K&W for breakfast and follow him to Fort Bragg for the test session. I go to K&W that morning and meet Bill for the first time and he introduced me to some of the group. I was impressed as to the welcoming I received and was able to put faces with the voices I was hearing on my scanner. I passed both written tests and then the wait was on for the ticket to arrive by mail. Back then you could not operate until you had the license in hand and it took around ten weeks for that license to arrive. In the meantime Field Day rolls around while I am waiting around for the license to arrive. Bill tells me to come out to Field Day and hang out with the gang. I walk up to the cw station and Bill is operating and carrying on a conversation with me at the same time. I was in awe as to how he could do that and the cw sounded like a blur of dits and dahs. Anyway I told myself I wanted to be able to do that one day and two Field Days later there I was sitting beside Bill operating cw and also with my other cw friends being Chuck KJ4RV, Van N4ERM, Pete K4QFK, and Bob KL7NL who became the charter members of the Dream Team(that's another story for later).

That began many years of Field Days and many fond memories as that first year was 1991 and since then I only missed one Field Day. In addition to Field Day there were meetings, public service events, hamfests, Christmas Dinners and hanging out at Harry's shop. We sure had more fun than should be allowed and I enjoyed every minute of it and I know Bill did as well. Unfortunately Bill lost his daughter in 1994 after a long fight with cancer. I, as well as some of you shared tears with Bill during this time before and after her passing in 1994. Fast forward to April 15, 2010 and I get the same news about my daughter that Bill received about his daughter. Bill knew the road we were getting ready to travel and he was the one person who understood more than anyone. Parents who go through such a thing share a bond and unless you have lived it you can't truly understand what it is like to be told your sixteen year old daughter has been diagnosed with cancer. But

President David KI4W was the net controller for the CFARS 2m Evening Net/Monthly Meeting. David KI4W called the meeting to order after taking check-ins and led the Pledge of Allegience to the flag of our country. Paul K4PGM gave the invocation.



Marty W4MLW moved to accept the minutes of the February meeting with the following correction: the computer donated as the door prize was donated by Larry N4USB and repaired by Ryan KN4WNH. Steve KA4CZL moved to accept and the minutes were approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Treasurer: Chuck KJ4RV gave the Treasurer's report for March, we had money, we collected money, we spent money, and we have money left.

Net Manager: Chuck KJ4RV gave the Net Manager report, February we had 723 checkins for 25 average per net, 1143 minutes for 39 minutes per net. March we had 916 checkins for 29.5 average per net, 1343 minutes for 43 minutes per net. Let's keep the repeaters warm and working folks, great job.

Health & Welfare: Carl K4CFB had no reports for Health and Welfare.

Repeater: Ben KM4ODT reported that the 2m and 440m repeaters were working, and the 6m repeater continues to be a work-in-progress.

Membership: David KI4W reported on new members: Jeff Carroll K4DOL and Chris Loranger W4EKO. We will get packets out to them.

Swapfest: Swapfest will be at the Cumberland County Shrine Club on August 8, and already has several table reservations for the event.

Emergency Coordinator: Emergency Coordinator Mike K4JWX is working with surrounding counties concerning emergency preparedness. Spring Lake shelters are still in flux.

VE Testing: David KI4W reported that the VE Test sessions are on hold currently, until the lifting of the stayat-home social distancing experiment.

Field Day: David KI4W reminded everyone of Field Day dates on June 27-28. Plans are for Methodist University, but currently TBD.

Public Relations: Marty W4MLW reported that the CFARS Facebook page is a good place for information about the club and its operations and George KM4ODS is keeping it current.

Possum Trot Net: Ron K4FET reported that checkins have dropped into the 40s per net from the 50s of last month and places blame on the stay-at-home slug-a-beds.

Webmaster: Steve KI4EZL gave the Webmaster report and that we need to pay for the annual subscription for the website.

Bill knew even though his daughter was older when she was diagnosed it was still the same. Our story had a happy ending where Bill's with his daughter did not and any time Bill and I talked he would always inquire how my daughter was doing. That was Bill. Enough of that now on to some of the many contributions Bill made to CFARS and the amateur community. For around thirty years Bill kept our repeaters on the air. There were days he made two trips in one day all the way from Rockfish to Methodist University when the repeaters needed attention. Bill was also the Chapter Head for the Possum Trot Chapter of Ten Ten International and called two ten meter nets on Sunday, one on ssb and one on cw. It was cw he enjoyed and there were countless Sundays he and I and AJ W4EK(sk) played cw. We sure had fun jerking AJ's chain and if you knew AJ he took it all in stride. Some days AJ would turn up the speed just to make Bill work a little harder and it was all in good fun and good practice for me keeping up with them. Bill was also a Volunteer Examiner and during the days of cw testing we had fun in the code room along with Van, Chuck, and Fred. The biggest contribution Bill made to the amateur radio community was that if you needed help he was there. All you had to do was call or say you needed help with an antenna, radio, etc. and he was there. Bill was a friend to all. After several attempts of trying to get a 1x2 or 2x1 call sign I finally succeeded in February. I regret greatly that KI4W never got to work KU4W. The CFARS family has lost a valued member. We would all do well to follow in the amateur radio footsteps of Bill Kelchner KU4W.

Our next meeting will again be on the air on May 18 at 7:00pm on the 91 repeater. I hope to have some news on the status of Methodist University by then. If we get clearance we have a test session scheduled for June 13, a meeting on June 15, and Field Day on June 27-28 with set up on the 26th.
