What motivated you to get licensed? Looking at the potential future of the communications infrastructure, I decided that our family needed to have a way to communicate that is not reliant on the internet or cell phones. I looked back at Citizens Band radio for emergency communications and it seemed to be barely utilized. Ham radio was the next best choice for emergency communications. I went forward and began the licensing process.

When did you start your journey as the CFARS Volunteer Examiner Coordinator? As I began becoming more familiar with the CFARS club I came to learn that Pat N4UGH was looking to step away from her VE duties. I was only a General at the time and I expressed

an interest in assuming the responsibilities. As a result, I accelerated my studies and successfully tested for the Extra certification. I then went on to complete the VE training. All this happened in late 2020 and early 2021. Pat worked with me on a few testing sessions then I went solo beginning in late 2021.

What do you currently do with Amateur Radio? I like participating in the special events that occur throughout the year. Events such as the Route 66 and 13 colonies. I also love hunting POTA contacts. Although I am not too interested in contesting. I also love building kits and repairing radios. This usually leads to Elmer opportunities as well. I am a retired IT professional so the computer hardware/software aspect of Ham radio is also an area where I can help others.

What are the K4BUC's top three must have tools for Ham Radio? One needs a good communications go bag for portable operation. Well-constructed antennas and proper analyzer tools. This is essential when going out into the field. One needs to be able to troubleshoot any issues that may arise. Also, when working from home, the shack/radio room should be well organized and environmentally comfortable in all seasons. Also, If you are going to do any radio builds or repairs, a good ESD rated soldering station, digital volt meter and some type of magnification is very necessary.

What is your dream Parks On The Air activation? May be an exotic location, or a POTA combo? Antarctica would be a great place to activate a POTA park in my opinion. Although my interest is more in the hunting than activating, I would love to make a POTA contact with Antarctica. Also, A special thank you to "the darling old man" NC4XL and Mike KN4XP for the training in POTA. My first time activating with them was an extreme experience. They have it down to a science.

What or who inspires you to get out of bed in the morning? What usually inspires me to get out of bed in the morning is my bladder. Like many people my age, it is nature's alarm clock.
