

Bluetooth for your Ham Radio:

"El Cheapo," Van, N4ERM

This project started off as sort of a challenge from Chuck, KJ4RV. At a recent CFARS meeting he commented: "Wish someone would come up with a Bluetooth interface so that I could participate in radio while doing other things." I took up the challenge. This is the result.

On consulting the internet, it was apparent that I was not a pioneer in the Bluetooth-to-ham-radio-interfacing activity. After studying others' efforts, I settled on a simple solution by K7SFN, who used an off-the-shelf Bluetooth interface: the Jabra A-210. The Jabra A-210 was manufactured to provide Bluetooth capability for non-Bluetooth equipped cell phones. I was surprised that I didn't know about this stuff while I was still *in the business*! The A-210 is no longer manufactured, but I purchased "reconditioned mint" one with charger on EBay for \$35.00. [NOTE: the first one I purchased didn't work, but that's a story for another time.]

Interfacing the A-210 to the radio (Kenwood TS-570 in my case) was easy other radios even easier. The A-210 has a single tip-ring-sleeve connector. They use tip for mic input, ring for audio output, and sleeve for common ground. This made the cross-connects easy.

After synching my Bluetooth earpiece with the Jabra, I tried it out. I could immediately hear through the earpiece. With the rig set to VOX, I tested out the transmit with Kelly, N4EWG, then with the ADY net. All reported good audio. With Kelly, I experimented with the range of the interface. My shack is on the second floor and I could easily interface from the ground floor garage.
