

Software Defined Radio By Ben Bassett, KM4ODT

The Hack RF is a relatively lower cost *transceiver* geared toward those that want the ability to experiment, design, and develop their own capabilities using <u>GNU radio software</u>. Although not intended to be used as an amateur radio, it can provide the Ham with a better understanding of radio/SDR principles.



RSP Spectrum Analyzer

The above spectrum analyzer further demonstrates the wide variety of capabilities of SDR where the software is the true workhorse. This screen shot was taken in the 433MHz band. The incidence at approx. 433.94MHz is my outdoor weather sensor broadcasting its data.
