

The summer has absolutely FLOWN by, and we've all been roasted and toasted with our hot dry summer weather. Now that we've had a slight cool-down, it may remind us to start looking forward to fall and our next year of guild meetings.

#### **NEW MEETING LOCATION**

I want to take this opportunity to remind everyone that our in-person meeting location has changed! Starting Monday September 8, we will be meeting at Kingsview United Church. The address is 505 Adelaide Ave E, Oshawa, ON L1G 2A4. The church is located on the South side of Adelaide, between Central Park Blvd N. and Wilson Rd. N. Below is a google maps image with the location of the church, marked up to show the entrance and exit to the parking lot, the parking closest to the meeting, and the location of the gym entrance that we will be using. If driving down Adelaide from the east, note that the entrance to the church is JUST AFTER the school, and you don't have much of a chance to see the actual church before you've ended up driving past the entrance. I have also provided a photograph of the exterior of the gym (the east-most building extension), with a yellow circle drawn around the entrance we will use. 

# **Quilt Block of the Month Convener**Diane W.

As something a little different from a traditional block of the month, this year we will be focused on learning a Quilt As You Go (QAYG) Easy Cover Strip Method by Monica Poole while using a fun and easy pattern by Atkinson Designs called Lucky Star. It is a great use for those fat quarters and smaller batting pieces that have been hanging out in your sewing space.

#### What you will need:

- Pattern: Every participant is responsible for purchasing their own individual pattern. There are no additional fees to join this year's Block of the Month.

  - Your local quilt store may also have a paper pattern or be able to order it for you!



• Backing: You can pick a backing fabric that is consistent for the whole quilt back OR have a scrappy backing out of your fat quarters. Each block will require a 15.5" backing square

- Important Note: Avoid stripes or directional fabrics for your backing. All over designs vs. solids will help hide your quilting if you are beginner.
- Batting: For this QAYG technique, batting has to be 1" less than the block size. So for this pattern, these are 14.5" batting squares.
- Sashing: In addition to the fabric requirements on the pattern, you will eventually need fabric for the QAYG sashing. How much you need will depend on the size of the quilt. A meter will be enough if you are doing a throw or baby quilt. For April, you will need a 1" (25 mm) bias tape maker to make the sashing. More to come on that!

Lucky Star only has ONE type of block to piece but each month we will try different quilting ideas. Because everyone will want to make a different size quilt, to enter the monthly draw you only need to submit one (1) block for that month's selection. No rush and no stress! I even have two 'catch up' months built in!

MaryLou and Judy are looking forward to being your Social Convenors this year and we will see you on Monday, September 8th.



Fabric Requirements...
5 fat quarters that go together
Background Fabric
You may put in more Fabric if you wish.

Please bring your fabrics In a plain paper bag with your name inside to the SEPTEMBER meeting. I will exchange the fabrics and return your SECRET FRIENDS fabrics to you at the OCTOBER meeting. If you miss bringing your fabrics for the exchange in September you can bring them to my house before the next meeting and still get in on the fun.

The more the merrier fun. Let's change this up. Get those quilting juices flowing. Try out a new/old pattern using a friends colour choices. The REVEAL is a Show and Tell.

Welcome back quilters, we hope you have been able to spend some time sewing over the summer. When it's too hot to be outside, I spend my time indoors in my sewing room. Housekeeping can wait!

We look forward to receiving any projects you may have made with us in mind over the summer.

This year, we are collecting:

- Placemats for Community Care Meals on Wheels (12" x 16" are preferred)
- Pillow cases for Comfy Cases (hot dog type are super easy)
- Neutral yardage if you are cleaning out your sewing room.
- Completed tops with binding for **Quilts of Valour**. Please ensure they meet the size criteria from Quilts of Valour, minimum size 50 x 70, maximum size 60 x 80 and include binding fabrice with your quilt top. We have had discussions with the Q of V representative, and they have copious amounts of backing and batting at their disposal. We will facilitate a drop off to them of your tops and binding. If you would like to submit a completed quilt to them (quilted and bound) we will gladly accept them on their behalf from our member. - Completed tops with binding for Quilts for Survivors as well. They have no minimum or maximum sizes, however, they do have specific criteria about the types of fabric patterns they would like in the quilt tops created for the Survivors. For information on that, please check their website at <a href="https://www.quiltsforsurvivors.ca">https://www.quiltsforsurvivors.ca</a> check out their 'contribute' page for details.
- The Pregnancy Help Centre has indicated flannel receiving blankets and bibs are a hot item and would love to receive some, if you have some time to make either of these, we will make the delivery
- Lakeridge Health NICU unit is looking for isolette covers and flannel receiving blankets as well. The size they are looking for is roughly 40" x 44". We will facilitate a drop off after the October meeting.

Each month we have kits to be signed out for completion and receive completed items from the members. We currently have over 300 kits made up ready for members to assemble. Don't forget to fill in the tag that came with your quilt kit. We keep track of all the member activities.

If you wish to support us by making a complete quilt, that is absolutely amazing and we love those. Please make sure your name and the size of the quilt is provided when you hand it in at the meeting. Ask for a label anytime at the meeting. Labels should be sewn on before handing in.

We are planning to have another sew weekend May 2 & 3, 2026. Kindly mark your calendars. Many hands make light work on these days.

Last year we donated over 200 quilts to various organizations in the Durham Region. If you have suggestions for us to donate to, please see Kate or Lyne to share contact information.

Do you belong to a service organization and maybe looking for a quilt for a silent auction or raffle? Contact Dorothy or Kate to see what we have on hand.

The bag has been purged and ready for your fresh new scraps to be looked through and enjoyed by others! It's lots of fun to find your scraps reinvented and sewn into someone else's quilt.

**DTOG Scrap Definition**: a scrap is a piece of fabric BIGGER than your outstretched hand and at least as wide as your palm. Of course it is also 100% COTTON quilting fabric. Please DO NOT add in any polyester, silk, drapery, linings, shortening pant leg cut offs, etc!!! We purge those fabrics as our Scrap hunters are only looking for 100% COTTON scraps to add into their quilting creations.

#### **All Star Sampler Platter**

The guild has been made aware of a great opportunity to see short demonstrations from many different teachers (thank you Diane W). The guild has registered for this program, and all guild members are able to join in and participate in this on-line event. Mark your calendars for September 27 and 28 – the actual hours will be announced later, but during this time, there will be 18 different teachers each providing a 15 minute demonstration. In total, there will be 6 hours of instruction over the 2 days. There will also be an 18-page PDF that each viewer can download, which contains a page dedicated to each mini-workshop or lecture.






