At the end, all who "switched" all year, will have enough fabric to make a pattern that will be shared. If you have not signed up yet there is still time to get started. Just bring your six emerald green squares to the September meeting and sign up with Lynn M.

Fabric colour of the month is as follows: Jewel Tones

September	Emerald Green
October	Magenta \ Fuchsia (pink)
November	Ruby \ Red
December	Purple
January	Royal Blue
February	Burnt Orange \ Orange
March	Dark Turquoise (greenish -blue)
April	Burgundy
May	Amethyst (pinkish violet to deep purple)

### **<u>COMMUNITY OUTREACH - CUDDLE QUILT PROGRAM – Diane, Charlene,</u> Linda and Lisa**

This summer, Charlene and Diane delivered 56 cuddle quilts to the Children's Aid and to the Rose of Durham. At the Children's Aid, the nurses use the quilts to console the children in their care and at the Rose of Durham they put a quilt in the baskets given to young single moms. We received a nice thank you note from both organizations. It was hard to listen to some of the hardship stories, so we can be sure that the help we give them is very worthwhile.

We are continuing to have kits available for all our members to put together as well as tops to quilt. We will continue going to Whirls 'n Swirls to do some long arm quilting and everyone is welcome to try.

I hope everyone is having a great summer and are now getting ready for our show in October.

### **Backpacks for The Denise House**

At the spring retreat, we asked members to make a backpack for the children at The Denise House, which is a local shelter for women and children fleeing abusive situations.

We had a number of backpacks completed at the retreat. If you took one home from the retreat, would you please bring it to the September meeting (even if you didn't finish it). Now, we'd like to ask members to donate items to go into these backpacks to give to Denise House. We will be stuffing them at a later date. We will put out a call for volunteers at that time.

Looking for suggestions? Toothpaste & toothbrushes, small colouring books, crayons, small toys (i.e., matchbox cars), markers, notebooks, play doh, glue sticks & other small craft kits, small stuffed toys, bubble bath. For the older kids: decks of cards, pencil crayons, notebooks, makeup, bath stuff, small bottles of lotion, deodorant, hair clips, hair brushes, combs, etc. This is a small sampling of the list of items to donate, so if there's something else you think they would enjoy, bring it to the meeting. No two backpacks will be stuffed alike!

Remember, some of these kids left their family homes with nothing but the clothes on their backs. The contents of the backpacks should be especially for them.

### **BLOCK OF THE MONTH - MYSTERY QUILT – Angie S.**

I hope everyone had a great summer and is ready to start a new year with the Durham Trillium Quilters' Guild. I am excited to be doing the Block of the Month this year and have a finished quilt to show you at the September meeting. Below are the fabric requirements along with a picture of the quilt we are doing. I will be giving instructions for the first block after the September meeting, so sign up for this beautiful quilt. I will be sending instructions by e-mail every month. I will be happy to answer any questions at the meeting. See you there!

Designer: Monique Dillard of Open Gate Quilts

**Finished quilt:** 55-1/2" × 73-1/2" **Finished blocks:** 9" square

Pick Your Background Fabrics:

First, choose a light color for the background fabric in the blocks, setting pieces, pieced inner border, and middle border. (For her quilt, Monique used assorted cream and tan prints.)

Here are the amounts you will need:

Blocks: four 18×22" pieces (fat quarters) of assorted light prints

Setting pieces and pieced inner border: two 5/8-yard pieces and two 1/3-yard pieces of assorted light prints Middle border: 1/2-yard light print

Choose Your Medium Fabrics:

Select one or more medium colours, which will be used in the blocks, setting pieces, and pieced inner border. (For her quilt, Monique used assorted red prints.)

Here are the amounts you will need: Blocks: five 9×22" pieces (fat eighths) of assorted medium prints Setting pieces and pieced inner border: five 3/8-yard pieces of assorted medium prints

Gather Your Dark Fabrics:

Choose one or more dark colors, which will be used in the blocks, outer border, and binding. (For her quilt, Monique used assorted black prints.)

Here are the amounts you will need: Blocks: Three 18×22" pieces (fat quarters) of assorted dark prints Outer border: 1-1/4 yards of dark print Binding: 5/8 yard of dark print

#### **SUNSHINE – Sharon M.**


