PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE – Lyne M.

First things first, I can't believe that we have experienced bad weather on the first Tuesday of the last two months and that our guild meetings had to be cancelled! Who would have thought?!? I am looking forward to seeing all of you at the 7 March meeting – with lots of Show and Share!!! I sure hope the weather cooperates!

How do you pick your projects? For me, it's either a reason – someone's having a baby, celebrating an anniversary, etc. – or I get inspired by the fabric. The panel on the photo inspired me to make a lap quilt for my son's future in-laws' cottage. The moose, the cabin, etc., just lends itself to a cottage throw. Then I used flannels from the quilt I made for their daughter in the log cabin blocks. It tied the whole thing together. It has meaning for me and made sense to make this one for them. Two things happened when this quilt was received. One, my son said he thought the blocks around the moose were really cool which gave me the opportunity



to talk to him about the log cabin block and how old it is, etc. Two, this frugal quilter who never buys fabric at full price (unless it's the perfect fit for a project), bought the backing at full price because it was PERFECT – cottage themed in tone on tone olive green. I am sharing that because when the quilt was received, I was told it was so beautiful that they would hang it on one of the walls at the cottage. So, it will go to the cottage, however, the perfect fabric at the back, will never be seen! But I will still know it's there!!!

Will I ever buy fabric at full price again? Of course I will! As the "artist", I love knowing that I chose every aspect of a project for a reason. Yes, it may not be appreciated to the same extent as I would wish sometimes, however, if I would have just put any piece of fabric on the back of this throw, knowing that olive green cottage fabric was out there, I would not have been satisfied 100% with its outcome. I quilt because I love the process – finding a project, figuring out who it's for and how I'm going to do it (I rarely follow a pattern...), picking the fabrics, and the actual work of cutting, piecing, etc. The finished product for me is the prize. Giving it away is the bonus.

Please take the time to read this entire newsletter, especially since we have missed two membership meetings. It is jammed packed with information about future events that I know you want to take part in.



Slab Block Quilts for Ronald McDonald Houses – Sharon M.

I hope you are busy making your slab blocks. If not, there is still time to get started. The blocks need to be 12.5 x 12.5 on the table. A small quilt needs 12 blocks and a large quilt needs 24 blocks.

I will be bringing Canadian fabric pieces to the March and April meetings. Each block needs one piece of the Canadian fabric. The rest of your block can be any combination of your scraps. If you have fabric to share, bring it along for the scrap basket.

At the May meeting we will be putting the blocks together to make the flimsies, sandwiching and quilting as well as making binding. So we will need people to sew, iron, and pin. There will be a job for everyone. Samples will be shown at the March meeting.
