

This quilt is 62 1/2" x 76 1/2". There are 2 blocks each month which are the same but reversing the color. I picked a focus fabric and then chose my other colors from that.

Please bring your completed quilt from last season's BOM to the October meeting, and you will be eligible to win a grand prize. I'm looking forward to seeing all the finished quilts.

We will be doing things a little differently this year by eliminating the monthly prize and only having a draw for the completed quilt at the end (the winner will receive a gift certificate). As before please bring in your finished blocks to each meeting so we can display them.

The October meeting will feature Kathy Wylie. Kathy is a multiple international-award winning quilter specializing in appliqué techniques in a "contemporary traditional" style. She lectures and teaches all over the country at guilds, shops and quilt shows and is a CQA/ACC Certified Quilt Judge. Her work has been featured in magazines, and her designs have been published as individual patterns as well as in her book "Sewflakes: Papercut Appliqué Quilts".

FABRIC EXCHANGE – Mary C.

Welcome to the Durham Trillium Quilters' Guild Fabric Exchange. This year's fabric exchange will be 10 inch squares, of style/print indicated below. Every month you will exchange 6 squares of a specific colour (see list below). Please no solid/plain fabrics, and no novelty, seasonal prints or batiks. The selvage should be cut off the fabric <u>before</u> cutting the squares. For each fabric, you will require 0.5 meter or 20 inches. If you cut 2 strips, each 10" x Width of Fabric, you will get 8 squares. Keep 2 squares for your stash. PLEASE USE QUILT SHOP QUALITY FABRIC!

The fabric colours of the month for the exchange are as follows:

September deep pink tone on tone October floral/black background

November small stripes on white background

December...... floral deep pink January..... black and white February..... blue florals

March..... teal green tone on tone

April..... purple floral May.... circles colorful



When handing in your squares please put in ziplock bag with your name marked clearly. Thanks and have fun collecting your fabric. If you can't come to a meeting, please arrange for a friend to bring the fabric in for you, or bring it in advance. If there are questions, please contact Mary C. (see guild membership list).

PLEASE NOTE: Bring BOTH the <u>September AND October</u> fabric strips to the first meeting of the vear, on October 3rd.

If you haven't signed up yet, it's not too late – just bring your 2 months (Sept and Oct) fabric to the October 2nd meeting, and sign up then!

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

CUDDLE QUILT PROGRAM – Laura F., Sherry F., Linda W.

Welcome back everyone! Hope you enjoyed the summer and were able to find some time to quilt! We look forward to seeing everyone at the next meeting. Please stop by our table, even if it is just to say Hello!

At the last meeting in June, we had 22 finished quilts returned. Thank you to Andrew S. (12), Maureen E. (5), Sharon M (2), Renne D., Linda W. and Laura B. We also had 4 pieced tops returned. Thank you to Sharon M (2), Linda W. and Sandy P. Don't forget that all pieced quilt tops and finished quilts are eligible for the draw at the end of the meeting. June's winner was Diane D.

As always, we are still looking for fabric. If you have anything to donate, please bring it to the meeting and drop it off at our table. These fabrics will be made into kits to support local charities.

The 2017-2018 guild year was very successful. 164 quilts were donated to charities in the Durham region: Children's Aid Society (90), Rose of Durham (21), Denise House (20), Grandview Kids (12), Durham Elder Abuse (12), and the Pregnancy Help Center (9). Also 71 pairs of mittens were donated to the Children's Aid Society.

Over the Summer, we received 34 completed quilts. 30 quilts from Linda W. (12 DTQG Kits and 18 donated from her stash), Whirls'n Swirls (3) and Sandra F. (1). Sherry F. completed 6 pieced quilts tops and Laura F. (1).



New for 2018 - 2019 - If you donate a completed quilt (from your own stash) and would like it to go to a specific charity in Durham, please pin the name of the designated charity to the quilt along with your name and we will do our best to ensure that the quilt is delivered to them.

PLACEMAT (SUMMER) CHALLENGE – Laura F., Sherry F.

From October through December, we will be collecting placemats for Meals on Wheels Durham. The placemats should be approx. 13" x 17" and made preferably from Christmas or Holiday themed fabrics, but any fabric is welcomed. Meals on Wheels Durham will include a placemat with their special Christmas dinner that is delivered to members of our community in December. Recipients are often house-bound and feel isolated and this lets them know that someone in the community is thinking of them. Meals on Wheels supports approximately 200 people in Whitby/Oshawa and 45 in the Clarington Area. So we would really like to surpass our initial challenge of 100 placemats so no one is left out. I know we can do it!!
