The **Boutique** Team headed by Debbie W. handed out kits last month for boutique items and are expecting to have them returned in November, so that you may take another kit! And sew on and sew on! Thanks to everyone who picked up a kit. The group is looking for your leftover zippers, batting, large grommets, smaller grommets (with tool if applicable), heavy iron-on interfacing, terry cloth, rick rack, ribbon, d-rings, split rings, decorative rope and FABRIC just to name a few. If you're cleaning out your sewing room or finishing a project and have a few bits left over, they would certainly put them to good use. We will have sew-days for boutique coming up, dates will be confirmed as we go.

When you are cleaning or sorting out your sewing room this year please save any unwanted items for the Show **Treasure Table**. This would include fabrics, quilting tools, craft items, craft/quilting books, zippers, ribbons, elastics, patterns, quilt blocks, unfinished kits etc. If possible, please store your Treasure items in a box at your house until we are ready to collect them. The "Treasure Table" was a favourite visiting spot at the last show and made a lot of money. Remember, your unwanted items are another person's Treasure find.

PLACEMAT (SUMMER) CHALLENGE - Laura F., Sherry F.

From So far we have collected 146 placemats for Meals on Wheels Durham. We have surpassed our initial challenge of 100 placemats. Since Meals on Wheels supports approx. 200 people in Whitby/Oshawa area and 45 in the Clarington area, we have increased our challenge to 250 placemats so no one is left out. We still have two months to go in the challenge, so I know we can do it!!

The placemats should be approx. 13" x 17" and made preferably from Christmas or Holiday themed fabrics, but any fabric is welcomed. Meals on Wheels Durham will include a placemat with their special Christmas dinner that is delivered to members of our community in December. Recipients are often house bound and feel isolated and this lets them know that someone in the community is thinking of them.
