QUILT SHOW 2019 “Threads Of Friendship Quilt Show” – Kate H.

November 22 & 23, 2019 - General Sikorski Hall, Oshawa.

I hope that you have been thinking about the show over the summer as the show committee has been meeting monthly to finalize details for our upcoming show. We have lots of information to share with you, so please read on...

First of all, we’ve had a change in the charity we are supporting with our raffle quilt. We are now supporting **Rose of Durham**. They were very excited to jump on board. A representative from Rose of Durham will be at the September guild meeting to share some of their programs with us. It coincides with the raffle tickets being available for members to sign out for selling. Please see our **raffle coordinator, Cheryl A.**, to pick up your packages of raffle tickets to sell.

Our volunteer **coordinator, Diana S.**, will have her lists posted for you to fill in your available times to help during the show. Many hands make light work. We need helpers on all days of the quilt show and on set up day. There are so many jobs to do, you would not believe me. We will talk about the jobs at the September meeting. Do you have a student who is in need of some community service hours? Sign them up for Saturday’s take down. By that time, we (the show committee and volunteers) will be really tired and would really appreciate having some younger people to help! There’s a saying that it takes a village to raise a child, well, consider this quilt show as your child.

Whoa! Before we get to set up day, we need your quilts and quilting items registered!

Registration of quilts to be displayed at this show will be done electronically via our website (except the challenge fabric quilts). The registration site is up and running, so feel free to register your quilts right away! As of the time of newsletter issue, 13 quilts were already registered! To register your quilt, go to the guild’s website and navigate to the page for the quilt show (<http://www.durhamtrilliumquiltersguild.ca/2019->

[show.html](#)). Then click the button off to the right that says “DTQG Members - Quilt Entry”. Register each quilt individually (one at a time). You can register as many quilts as you like, however, should we run out of space for all quilts, we will implement a 3-quilts-per-member display limit. Therefore, when registering, we ask you to indicate your top 3 quilts, so we can ensure to display the ones you want shown the most. Paper registrations will not be accepted. If you do not have a computer, please try to find someone else with a computer to help you. The executive is looking into having someone to help do electronic registrations at a future meeting or sew day (details will be provided in future newsletters / meeting announcements). If you need help with on-line registration, questions can be sent to **registration coordinator, Laura B.**, via the guild’s email durhamtrilliumqg@yahoo.ca. Gail L. reported that it was easy to register! Thank you for the endorsement, Gail! I myself have registered 2 quilts for the show, and it really was very easy.

Our **treasure table coordinators, Dorothy M. and Angie S.**, are now accepting items that you no longer need in your sewing room...such as books, magazines, kits, fabric, tools, and templates to name a few of the items they are looking for. The show is accepting donations at the September through November guild meetings, or you can set up a time to drop items off at Dorothy’s house (call her first). Please measure fabric being donated and put its size on a sticker or tag on the fabric.

To come to the show, you’re going to need a ticket! Advance tickets are \$5.00 and will be available from our **publicity coordinator, Lyne M.**, at the September meeting. All members are encouraged to support the show by buying a ticket regardless of whether you are volunteering or not. As a member who will be volunteering, you only need to buy one ticket, even if you volunteer Friday and come to the show as a guest on Saturday. There is no expectation that you, as a volunteering member, would need to purchase tickets for both days.

The **quilt show challenge & children’s display coordinator, Holly P.**, will be patiently waiting for October to have your challenge item handed in. I hope that you are working on yours, there is still time. Get creative, put on some music, perhaps the ‘Dance of the Butterflies’, I found this link to share for inspiration... <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RZqYW57meZg>. Some of us work really well under pressure, but please don’t miss the deadline of the October guild meeting to hand in your completed item.



The **Stocking Challenge** is due at the September meeting. Members in attendance will be able to Oooo and Ahhhh at your lovingly crafted masterpieces and vote on their favourite. I’m sure there’s a prize involved! Our **boutique coordinator, Debbie W.**, and her team, will also accept any items that you wish to donate to the boutique or any completed kits that you have done over the summer. Each member can donate up to 3 items to be sold, which will be displayed at the boutique table as space permits. Do you have something that you would like to enter into their consignment sale? Registration of quilted consignment items is on line as well: go to the guild’s website and navigate to the page for the quilt show (<http://www.durhamtrilliumquiltersguild.ca/2019-show.html>). Then click the button off to the right that says “DTQG Members – Consignment Entry”. Register each item individually (one at a time).

What would a show be without the vendors? Perhaps a little more display space, but not nearly as much fun. We have invited many brick and mortar shops to our show and our **vendor co-ordinator, Diane D.**, has been working hard to secure great shops from our local area and hopefully some you’ve never heard of. So far, we have Appleseed Quiltworks, Bolts and Bobbins, Quilters’ Cupboard, Sew Have Fun, Ultimate Sewing Centre and Whirls and Swirls Quilting already signed up. She’s still working on a few more, so watch for updates. Our vendors are a tremendous draw for the show, and I hope that you will shop at their booths.

Our **ticket-pull coordinator, Debbie K.**, has asked for members of the guild to each donate a fat quarter so that she may get creative in making fabric shaped flowers to display in bunches for you to buy tickets. Who wouldn't want a coordinated flower bunch!! What a great idea! Note that the items in our ticket pull section don't all have to be quilting-related. We do have some non-quilters at our shows, often known as husbands, who may fancy something there. Even kid related items would be awesome. Why not get together with some friends to put together a collection of items? Keeps the cost for you down and increases the value of the items at the sale.

Our **tea room coordinators, Gail, Kathy & Gwen**, have decided on serving 4 kinds of sandwiches at the show. They are also looking for your culinary skills to be put to the test by baking some delicious goodies in the form of cookies, squares, loaves, and tarts! Oh my... see the sign-up sheet at the September meeting as some items are required in limited amounts.

For this show, we will be having a Feature Quilter. Our own Anne M. has agreed to show off her quilts and share her journey in quilting. Anne was my first contact at the guild. I am honoured that she has agreed to be our Feature Quilter. She has always been someone I have looked up to for her quilting skills as well as a great resource for our guild.

We are getting revved up for the show, it's only a couple of months away. Time will pass very quickly! Lots to get done, but, great teamwork makes the dreamwork. Everyone on the committee is excited about the final push to get the show off the ground for the membership. I hope that you will volunteer your time, finish your quilts (did I mention registration??) and support the show. We need you all front and centre...after all, this is membership's show. People will come to see the quilts, admire your skills regardless of your level, enjoy some delicacies from the kitchen, and shop with our vendors. It's going to be a wonderful show!

Please join us as we will all have more beautiful fabrics that way. This year at each meeting, we're exchanging 8 strips of Batik, each 2 1/2" strips of Batik. The colours for the year are as follows:

- September: Dark midnight blue
- October: Light grey
- November: Dark Teal blue
- December: Light Teal
- January: Medium to dark Blue
- February: Light blue
- March: Purple
- April: light purple
- May: 4 strips of yellow/gold and 4 strips of green

Remember to remove the selvages and put your strips in a ziplock bag labelled with your name. Next month you will receive a bag with mixed strips of that colour to use in your quilt when you drop off your next colour.
