OFFICERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

VICE-PRESIDENT:

We are looking for an individual who has great leadership skills and is excited about our guild's goals. This candidate needs to be willing to spend two years in the VP role to then move into the President's role, and finally, move into the Past President position (two years in each position).

As VP, they will assist current President as required, including coordinating facilities for all meetings and special projects, organizing greeters for meetings, and new member

Community Outreach Membership Assistant Workshops & Retreats orientation.

The VP is also a member of the nomination committee.

TREASURER:

Are you a numbers person? Do you love spreadsheets and making things balance?

As the Guild's Treasurer, this person has charge of all funds received from various convenors who collect them from membership. They also process all e-transfers and issue cheques when required. They must maintain all records as necessary for internal auditing and prepare reports as required.

As well, with the help of the executive committee, prepare an annual budget which they track.



This is a two person position! Do you love to shop for books and bring inspiration to our membership? The Librarian researches and purchases new books and materials. Everything is catalogued using Excel, made available to members and tracked. They also conduct an annual review of all items and arrange a sale of culled items for membership. They contribute to the monthly Guild newsletter with updates when necessary.

The Assistant Librarian does just that! They assist as required on meeting nights and at inventory time. Picking books up at Guild's storage unit prior to meetings and returning them is also part of this position.

We have a member interested in **PROGRAM** the Librarian position, will you be their Assistant?!?

NEWSLETTER

Are you a communicator? Do you enjoy desktop publishing?

This person needs to set deadlines for convenors who contribute content to our Guild's newsletter on a monthly basis. Once all is received, that's when the fun begins! Including the art work from the Advertising convenor, the newsletter is cre-

ated to keep our membership informed of all the opportunities our Guild provides. The newsletter is also submitted to the Website convenor to have it loaded up on the web for members to access it.. The Newsletter publisher also sends email messages to our membership letting them know the publication is online. This is done using the Guild's email account.

Besides using a word processing program of their choice, the successful candidate should be able to use Excel to manage the list of members' emails.



Do you enjoy the variety of topics presented by our guest speakers at our Guild's monthly meetings? Would you like to be responsible for this important aspect of our guild meetings?

The Program convenor selects and arranges presenters for our monthly meetings, with the exception of December and June meetings. The proposed guests are submitted to the Guild's Executive committee for approval. Using word processing software and email, a contract is drawn and shared with all parties by the convenor. This contract is submitted to Treasurer as a request for payment to the presenter.



The Program convenor ensures all equipment required by guests is available on meeting night (projector, tables, etc.), is there to greet them and help as required (setting-up and take down if necessary).

SOCIAL

This position has been vacant for a year now. Do you miss having coffee or tea with a small treat at our Guild's monthly meetings? If you do, get involved!

The equipment to facilitate the hot beverages is currently kept at the Guild's storage unit and could be kept at the convenor's home, space permitting.

Creating a sign-up for members to indicate which months they will bring treats is also part of this position.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Would you like to facilitate a project for willing Guild members? It could be a pattern that you pick/design and separate into monthly chunks or it could be a block of the month program that already exists. The costs associated with this "club" is covered by the participants. Every month, instructions need to be sent out to participants.

This person needs to be able to use word processing

software, manage

emails and funds.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Can you see yourself leading a group of quilters who produce what is needed for our Guild to support our community? This should be a committee with a leader who would be the Community Outreach convenor.

This group prepares and tracks kits (quilt tops, quilts to be quilted or bound, walker bags, mittens, etc.), sorts through donated fabric, distributes finished items to approved charities in the Durham region, write a submission for the monthly newsletter, and maintain the Community Outreach budget.

The necessary supplies for this team may be kept in the Guild's storage unit or in someone's home.

Bins need to travel to and from our monthly meetings to facilitate members picking-up and dropping-off items.

If you would like to be involved in this very rewarding committee in any way, we would love to see this work continue.

ASSISTANT FOR MEMBER-SHIP

Patricia K. is our current Membership convenor. They could really use an assistant! Members of the Executive have filledin when required this year, however, if we had a person in place as Assistant, this would be a better process.

The Assistant to the Membership convenor would do just that – assist in any way necessary, including running the front desk when the convenor is away.

Possibly, this position could be the training grounds to become Membership Convenor?!?

The successful candidate needs to be helpful, friendly, and not be afraid to speak to people they may not know personally. They

will also assist in collecting fees and issuing receipts.



WORKSHOPS & RETREATS

This is another larger dockets! Great organizational skills and being resourceful are a must!

This convenor is responsible for planning (securing location, planning meals, activities, securing prizes, etc.) for all Guild retreats (away and at home). They also organize workshops and sew days, coordinating with Program convenor for workshops and other convenors for sew days.

They are also responsible for registrations and collecting fees for all events at our monthly meetings.

Do you feel like this is something you would like to take on? This is another area where we may benefit from having a team. We have a member who is currently interested in looking after Retreats. Would you consider running workshops and sew days? You could be part of a Dynamic Duo!
