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### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - Sharon M.

Hello fellow quilters, I hope everyone is staying home as much as possible and complying with the everyday actions we can all do to help prevent the spread of germs that cause respiratory illnesses like Covid-19.

The guild will not be meeting at the church or the retirement home until further notice, to be in compliance with health authority/government guidelines. However, as you have read from the email sent out, Laura has offered to conduct virtual meetings for us. This will happen at no cost to the guild as the company that Laura works with us has given her permission to use their account. This is great way for us to stay connected.

Unfortunately, the Elim Lodge retreat is also cancelled. The Sew day scheduled in May will more than likely be cancelled as well. You will be informed as soon as that decision is made. I sure you are disappointed, but the guild will be following the guidelines set by the health and government authorities.

Recruiting for a new executive and convenors is ongoing. We need our members to step up and help so we can start planning for next year.

For those members who decide that they want to make cotton face masks, Michael Garron Hospital (MGH) in Toronto is the only local hospital so far that is requesting homemade face masks. They are distributing these masks to visitors allowed in the hospital, discharged patients returning to the community and to members of the public to help reduce the spread. If you are looking for a pattern, Missouri Star Co, Jenny Doan has an easy pattern and a You Tube video that you can watch. There is also an interest in cotton bags that the medical staff can use to carry their scrubs and shoes home after a shift. A bag about 17 x 19 with a handle would be a good size. Daryl of Fabric Spark is collecting and distributing these bags to hospital staff. The guild is happy to share this information with you, but we are not participating as a guild group. The notice from MGH is attached to the end of the newsletter. If you need a bag pattern, I can send a couple of patterns to you but I'm sure you can find a simple bag pattern on You Tube or the internet.

I hope everyone takes advantage of our virtual guild meeting on April 13 at 7pm. STAY SAFE STAY HOME AND PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING!

### FABRIC BASKET - Jacqueline H. & Retta H.

### Top 5 things to do in your quilt room to reduce your SCRAP stash!

- #5 Dig out your teeny tiny scraps (< hand size) and set them aside as dog blanket stuffing for the Humane Society. You can cut them really small yourself and put them inside a pillowcase, and just sew up the end of the pillowcase for the dog bed. (NOTE: in case the dog gets it open and eats some of the fabric, pieces should be no longer than 3" to avoid gastrointestinal complications)
- #4 Go through fabric that hasn't been sorted into the proper bin yet. Take any that that doesn't make your heart sing AND is **the size of your hand or bigger** ... and put it aside to give to the fabric basket the next time we meet.
- #3 Go through your stash... bin by bin... shelf by shelf... box by box... and take out what doesn't make your heart sing. Set it aside... you can AUDITION it to see if you can let it go. Place it next to your guild bag. If once we are able to re-convene as a guild you still feel you are able to part with it, bring it along to the fabric basket.
- #2 Take a good cursory look around your quilting room. What would it look like through the eyes of someone who doesn't know you? Is it an inviting space? Or does it need some work? Are there scraps of fabric sitting on stools, or the backs of chairs that need to make its way to the guild scrap basket? Put it aside with the fabric you have set aside to AUDITION in step 3.
- #1 Breathe. Smile. Breathe again. Look around your uncluttered, sorted, organized room/space of glory.

Now celebrate with a cup of your favourite beverage, oil up your machine, change your needle, and since life has thrown us all scraps! Make Quilts.

If you are cleaning up and wish to donate your scraps immediately (cannot wait until next in-person meeting, whenever that ends up being), Kate H. is willing to be a collection point (front porch drop off). 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

MESSAGE FROM DR. JEFF POWIS, MEDICAL DIRECTOR, INFECTION PREVENTION & CONTROL, ASSOCIATE MEDICAL DIRECTOR, ANTIMICROBIAL STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM, MICHAEL GARRON HOSPITAL, TORONTO EAST HEALTH NETWORK

With the current pandemic there is a worldwide shortage of personal protective equipment (PPE).

To keep our community healthy and safe, Michael Garron Hospital is issuing a challenge to all east end sewists to collectively make 1,000 masks a week. We want to see all east enders wearing a fabric mask when they need to be within six feet of other people, especially vulnerable populations and the elderly.

It will be everyone's responsibility to keep their mask clean. We recommend washing masks daily with hot water and laundry detergent.

### HOW TO MAKE YOUR MASKS

You can download simple instructions here. Please note that the twist ties noted in the instructions aren't necessary.

We are promoting a simple 2-ply, pleated mask design. Along with standard sewing supplies (sewing machine, measuring tape, etc.), you will need:

- · dark-coloured polyester fabric for the outside of the mask (this could be substituted with 100% cotton if polyester is not available)
- · light-coloured 100% cotton for the part of the mask that goes against the skin
- · elastic

Please use clean fabric to make your masks. We will also be sanitizing all donated masks at the hospital.

### Who are the masks for?

- 1. All approved visitors who enter Michael Garron Hospital
- All of our discharged patients as they reintegrate into the community
- he broader Toronto East Community to help prevent disease transmission

### What will I need to make a mask?

We are promoting a simple 2-ply, pleated mask design.

Along with standard sewing supplies (sewing machine, measuring tape, etc.), you will also need:

- Dark-coloured polyester fabric for the outside of the mask (this could be substituted with 100% cotton if polyester is
- Light-coloured 100% cotton for the part of the mask that goes against the skin
- Elastic for ear loops (note: If elastic is not available, cloth ties can be used)

Please use clean fabric to make the masks. Michael Garron Hospital will also wash all masks before distributing them.
