Since we last reported in the April newsletter, the Community Outreach committee has been busy. We have completed 38 quilts. A huge thank you to Linda W. who completed 20 of those quilts and the remaining quilts were completed by Sherry F. and Laura F. At this time, I would like to thank all the guild members that supported Community Outreach over the last 2.5 years of our term. A special thank you to Linda W. and Sandra F. for volunteering their time and support.

As you know, a new convenor and team has not been found to take over Community Outreach. If you have any outstanding kits or donations, you can arrange to drop them off at my house (Laura F.) or keep them and we will collect them at the next in person guild meeting.

For the 2019/2020 guild year we completed 162 quilts, 61 placemats, 41 mittens, 30 walker bags and 3 dog beds for various charities in the Durham region. The 162 quilt total is down from our previous year's total of 211 quilts but keep in mind that members were focused on the guild's show at the beginning of the year and then we were not able to meet in person since April due to Covid-19.

## MEMBERS CORNER

### **Local Shops**

The executive would like to remind people to consider local quilt shops before shopping on line. Many of the local stores have either on-line purchasing or are arranging "no contact door pickup" types of shopping. We encourage you to support the local stores before shopping from a distance.

#### From last Show and Share

Margaret F. provided some very interesting information about carousels, along with her carousel-horse inspired quilts, but we were unable to read such long and detailed information during May's Show and Share. So, with her permission, we are sharing that information here, for your reading pleasure.

Here is my series of Carousel Art Trilogy Quilts when they were on display at the Boyd Gallery in Bobcaygeon. I made these over a period of about the last five years to showcase the three main styles of Carousel Art: From left to right; County Fair, Coney Island and Philadelphia.



County Fair horses are built to be fairly compact with minimal trappings in order that they may be moved from place to place when these carousels are dismantled and taken to other locations on the carnival circuit. County Fair master carvers include Allan Herschell, Herchell-Spillman and C.W Parker. My favorite horses on this quilt include the C.W. Parker "Lillie Belle" with its elaborate flying mane, the Allan Herschell "Trojan" horse, with its

sturdy neck and draft-horselike roached mane, and the C.W. Parker Bucking Bronco.

Coney Island horses are actually my favorite style. These horses have everything! Lots of glitz and jewels and often gold leaf manes. Carousel creators of this genre include Marcus Illions, C.W. Parker, Charles Carmel and Stein & Goldstein. S&G actually created some of the BIGGEST carousel horses ever made and they can still be found at Central Park and the former "Nunley's" carousel at Oyster Bay, also in New York.


Fun Fact: Charles I.D Looff built the FIRST carousel at Coney Island. Up until then Coney Island was all wilderness and grasslands. But Looff's carousel was such a huge hit that pretty soon he was building more, each bigger and more elaborate than the one before and having to hire employees as his factory became more prosperous. Next thing you know, other builders such as the ones previously mentioned were building carousels at Coney Island too. Back in the 20's there were literally dozens of them everywhere, on practically every street corner. If I had a time machine I would want to go to Coney Island in the 1920's!!

Last but not least are the Philadelphia carousels. These manufacturers include Philadelphia Toboggan Company, Dentzel, Muller and E. Joy Morris who was the predecessor of Philadelphia Toboggan Company. This quilt included the jester head that was usually seen on shields between the rounding boards of most Dentzel carousels, and the Philadelphia Toboggan Company logo. The carousel at Centre Island in Toronto is an excellent example of a Dentzel menagerie and there is a gorgeous P.T.C carousel at Canada's Wonderland. The bottom square in the middle showcases the Muller "Ghost" horse. The original is sadly lurking in the basement of the Sandusky Merry-Go-Round museum, but this magnificent steed used to ride the platform f the Cedar Point Frontierland carousel which eventually moved to Dorney Park. It's a long story but I would be happy to answer any questions!
