


#### President's Message - Debbie K




#### Sew Days - Jacqueline H

As a follow-up, one quilter, aged 98 at the time of the story, gives her perspective on the war effort in this article.


Pictured is Phyllis Vanhorne in her Kingston, Ontario sewing room. Her incredible contributions to the war effort and beyond are amazing achievements.

# May 9 Zoom Guild Meeting - Lina S

Speaker: Susan Madu | Topic: Blended Modern

Susan Madu is a CPA by day and a passionate creator and quilter by night. Susan has been quilting for over 25 years and garment sewing since she could reach up to a sewing machine.

Susan is never without a sketchbook or some project in her hands. Her quilting has evolved from making quilts from commercial patterns to designing her own patterns under the Modern Blended Quilts banner. Susan's patterns appeal to both traditional and modern quilters alike. A central theme of Susan's patterns is blending together elements of traditional and modern quilting.

Susan teaches regularly and has been described as a knowledgeable

instructor that takes great joy in sharing techniques and tips to help class participants be successful in their quilting projects. Susan shares her insights with humor from the perspective of having learned the hard way what not to do – "Ask me how I know!"

Susan has designed over 20 patterns and one of her innovative techniques in her pattern "Bright Squares" has been included in Studio 180 Design Ltd.'s Designer Gallery. Building our quilting community and supporting local quilt shops are important to Susan. Given this, her patterns can only be found in your local quilt shop. Susan's patterns are available to local quilt shops by her Canadian Distributor - Erie Quilt Art.

#### **Squaring Up Bad Blocks**

I'm sure we've all been there. Despite best efforts, there always that problem block that does not do what it is supposed to do.

I have quickly learned not to be hasty to start trimming to fix things, because that tends to just make things much worse.

Here's a great tutorial by Rachel Rossi that reviews the issue of adjusting a block that is too big or too small and how to reorient it to make it fit smoothly into your overall quilt design.

Her methodical approach makes sense, and helps guide that rogue block into place.

- please only send a maximum of 2-3 photos per quilt/project

You can send as many project emails as you like, but if there are a lot submitted, I will limit displayed projects to two per person. So, if submitting more than two projects, please indicate your preferred two or I will just randomly select them. Note that speaking about the quilts will be limited to one minute per quilt at the meeting. Don't forget - each submission qualifies for the monthly draw. I'm looking forward to receiving photos of your beautiful and inspiring projects.

# **Cheating HSTs**

Speed and accuracy don't seem possible when rotary cutting your fabric. However, Nancy Roelfsema has some great advice to make the process faster.



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
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#### **Best in Show**

# The Laws of Cat Quilting

- If it's not sewn down, chase it.
- If it's not pinned down, chew it.
- The closer you stay to a quilter's hands, the more gentle caresses you will elicit.
- Everything you step on is yours.
- Never neglect an opportunity to get in the way.
- If someone should try to pull the fabric out from under you, hold on tight.
- There has never been a quilt that hasn't been improved by a cat sleeping on it.
- A sewing basket is only as good as the number of cats that can crawl into it.
- Thread is always more fun when it's tangled around something.
- If it doesn't look right, sleep on it.
