## **President's Message:**

2022

Hello fellow guilters! The summer has flown by, and as I write this, September is almost upon us. As we look towards the end of the summer and the beginning of the new quilting guild's year, I find myself thinking of the topic of "change".

Changes happen all the time. Some are big and some are small. Some changes are in our personal lives, some in our work lives, and some occur in our extracurricular activities. In terms of our quilting guild, as I look back over the many years I have been a member of the Durham Trillium Quilters Guild, we have had many changes. Small changes occur regularly as our guild executive has new members from year to year, and/or people move to different duties. Some years we have quilt show and some years we do not. Larger changes have also been seen. When I joined the guild, meetings had been held on Tuesdays and were located at the Board of Education office and had been that way for many years. Changes in that facility led us to move to a new facility – our current church. The move to the church ended up with us moving our meetings to Mondays instead of Tuesdays. We weathered those changes and made it work.

And then more change was upon us. COVID-19 resulted in the halt of in-person gatherings: no more meeting in person; no more workshops or sew days; no more retreats. The executive came together and figured out a way to change to allow the guild to continue. We changed the meeting format to be virtual. We figured out how to have a celebration without the traditional potluck. Members, many of whom are not computer experts, figured out how to submit photos of their quilts electronically, so our show-and-share could continue, and we could still see the quilts people are making. A challenge met with excellence! We initiated virtual sew days. Convenors changed the way members could participate in the cuddle quilt program with pick-up and drop-off locations (and some personal pick-ups and drop-offs). We moved to a new website platform. And many of us got a chance to change the size of our stash in a different direction (i.e., making it smaller rather than making it bigger)!



As I look forward to the upcoming guild year, I know that more change is coming. We have a new executive, so some things will be done differently than before. For example, this year's mystery quilt will have a more modern feel than some of the past ones, giving us a chance to try something new. We are starting up inperson meetings again, which we haven't done in 2 years. Some things that we did before will stay the same, but some will change. We will be in a new era of COVID concerns. We have decided to have January, February and March be virtual meetings, in order to avoid past issues with nasty winter weather and still allow us to have great presenters who would not be able to join us in person. And, we are also going to have to change the meeting location from the current church.

Information about the various guild sections is included further on in this newsletter. With respect to the change of the meeting location, I wish to speak to people in person to introduce the new location. So we will discuss this topic at the September guild meeting at the Zion Church in Oshawa on Monday September 12 (doors open at 6:45 pm and meeting starts at 7:00 pm – NOTE: ONLY come in before 6:45 if you will help move tables!). If you cannot attend the September meeting, or if you want to revisit what was discussed at the meeting, we will post (on the website) a special-edition newsletter with information on the changes to the meeting location later in September.

The guild executive is gearing up for the new year and is prepared to meet the challenges that change presents to us. Please help me support the executive committee as they work hard to keep this guild running, so that we can continue to meet our mandate.

### **COVID 19 meeting considerations**

As we start in-person meetings again, how we will manage COVID-19 needs to be discussed. It is important that all members have a safe and healthy environment. Some members are at high risk for COVID. Some members live with or work with people at high risk. And we don't want anyone to get sick due to coming to our meetings.

The Durham Trillium Quilters' Guild will implement COVID-19 protection measures based on government and event location requirements that are in place at the time of in-person events. At the moment, there are no

masking mandates. Even when a masking requirement is not in place, it may still be encouraged by the Officer of Health to wear a mask in public settings.

Our guild will promote a mask-friendly environment at all meetings and events. People are encouraged to wear a mask if they feel the need to do so. We ask that everyone be kind, considerate, and respectful to one another and the choices that individuals make as to whether to wear a mask or not. It should be noted that the DTQG will not supply masks to persons – if a person wishes a mask, they need to supply their own.

IMPORTANT: Due to the nature of our meetings and the fact that we have several members who are either themselves at high risk or who have close family members at high risk for COVID, the DTQG executive respectfully requests that if you are sick or have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, please DO NOT ATTEND the guild's in-person meetings or events.

Happy Fall Everyone!!!


I can't believe how quickly the summer has passed. Isn't it wonderful to have the opportunity to be able to finally be back together again to share a hobby we are all passionate about.

## Mystery Quilt Block of the Month:

I thought I would take this year's Block of the Month program in an entirely new direction. No printed patterns will be provided. Each month a link will be sent out for participants to access a pattern or tutorial from the designer's site on the internet. Of course, if you have any problem accessing the information, please contact the convenor (Maureen E) and I will be happy to help you.

All the blocks will finish at 12 inches square. Consider using the same background fabric for continuity, your choice of colour. You may use scraps or coordinated fabrics for the design portion of the blocks. I chose to do mine with bright scraps on a white background. Bonus blocks will be available, giving a possible total of up to 18 blocks. This will give you plenty of options to choose your favourite designs. There will not be a finishing pattern. You may use any 12" block quilt pattern to make anything from a throw to king size quilt requiring 2 to 5 yards of background fabric.

The cost to participate in this program is \$5 per person, which will cover the cost of providing monthly prizes; registration is available on the guild website. The first pattern will come out in September, and patterns will be distributed monthly thereafter. Let's have fun sewing! I can't wait to see what you will create! # Fabric Basket: Read CAREFULLY to see when you can DROP off your scraps.

**DTQG SCRAP DEFINITION**: A scrap is a piece of fabric BIGGER than your outstretched hand. It should be at least as wide as your palm.

September Meeting ONLY Quilters with last names between A – F please bring in your scraps

October Meeting ONLY Quilters with last names between G-N please bring in your scraps

November Meeting ONLY Quilters with last names between O-Z please bring in your scraps

## Fabric Exchange 2022-2023

We will be having a fabric exchange using 5" squares with a workshop In May or June. The exchange will begin with the October meeting until May. Please remember to <u>use quilt store quality fabric and cut</u> <u>accurately.</u> No solid fabric but use prints or tone on tone.

The pattern is lap size and you will require 138, 5" squares in total. As our exchange will give you 128 squares you will be required to add 10 squares after the end of the exchange in order to achieve this number.

You will be handing in 16 - 5'' squares of the color assigned for that month and get back 16 - 5'' squares of different fabrics the following month. The more members signing up the more variety you will have. You will need to cut 2 strips of 5'' width of fabric and sub-cut into 16 - 5'' squares. You can use more than just one fabric choice of colour required. Please put your squares in a plastic baggie with your name and phone number written on the front. As we will not be having in person meetings for the months of January, February, or March, you will hand them in at the December meeting and receive them back in April. At the April meeting you will be handing in April and May colours in order to have all 5" squares for the workshop.
