TIPS and TRICKS from the Sew Day Social crew included.

- 1) When sewing two pieces together, sew with the side that has the most information facing you (all the seams and points facing you, versus the plain side of the fabric)
- 2) Dollar store boxes are great for storing fabric (for each project include, material, pattern and label)
- 3) When hand piecing, use finger pressing.

Fabric Basket:



DTQG SCRAP DEFINITION: A scrap is a piece of fabric BIGGER than your outstretched hand. It should be at least as wide as your palm.

Keep those hand sized scraps coming quilters. We have had to make a larger scrap bag to house all that you wish to unload. Many people go back to the scrap bag two or three times at one meeting. It is a great way to get fabrics for scrap quilts.


