2022 - 2023 Block of the Month

Please bring your finished 2022 - 2023 Block of the Month projects to our Tuesday October 10th (date moved from Monday due to Thanksgiving) guild meeting. Your project must include a minimum of nine blocks, be quilted, bound, and labelled to qualify for the \$50 annual prize. I look forward to seeing all of your awesome quilts.

2023-2024 Block of the Month

Hello Fellow Quilters, I'm Sandy M (SandyMac) and I will be providing inspiration to you over the next year as Convener of the Block of the Month program for our Guild.

Like Maureen, I will be providing 1 or 2, most likely 2, blocks per month (September to May) for you to create something beautiful, be it a full-size quilt, a table topper, table runner or wall hanging, whatever you desire.

I harken back to when my aunt belonged to a Guild in Toronto and what she learned from their program. It was designed to teach new techniques, to learn a new block or to relearn an old skill, it was a journey of discovery, a 'What can I do with this block'? My Aunt made many a quilt for family and friends from just one block She would also use one or more blocks to make jackets (other articles of clothing) or even bags. So let inspiration take you wherever it may go.

Each month, after our guild meeting, I will email a pattern or 2, for you to be inspired by. I'm using a coordinated fat quarter bundle (about 10 pieces) and have set aside roughly 3 meters of a corresponding background. You can do whatever you want, I personally don't do scrappy.

My source for the blocks is "Quiltmaker's 1,000 Blocks" and I have received approval to provide you with copies of the blocks as the book/material is copywritten. So, when you receive, via email, your block pattern, please do not share.

Fabric Exchange 2023-2024

This year the Fabric Exchange will be 10" squares, 6 per month for 8 months, beginning October 2023 and running to May 2024. Please remember to use quilt store quality fabrics and cut accurately. The pattern I will give out at the end of the exchange is for a lap size quilt and you will use all the squares from the exchange. The print on these squares should be very subtle, e.g., tone on tones or small prints. Colours should be "pure" (not brown based) but any shade is encouraged, e.g., blue can be anything from baby blue to royal. I will have a pattern for everyone at the conclusion of the exchange and you will see how well these fabrics will work for it. "Pure" colours are those that have been printed on a white base. Further explanation can be found on our website. I will have samples available at the meetings. I'm sure, without realizing it, many of you already know the difference between white and brown based fabrics



as evidenced by the beautiful quilts we see at our Show & Share. As we will not be having "in person" meetings for the months of January, February, and March, you will hand them in at the December meeting and receive them back in April. Registration can be found on our website. The more members signing up, the more variety you will have, so please join in.




