
Hello everyone,

Fabric Exchange 2022-2023

This year the Fabric Exchange will be 10" squares, 6 per month for 8 months, beginning October to May. Please remember to use quilt store quality fabrics and cut accurately. The pattern I will give out at the end of the exchange is for a lap size quilt and you will use all the squares from the exchange. The print on these squares should be very subtle, e.g., tone on tones or small prints. Colours should be "pure" (not brown based) but any shade is encouraged, e.g., blue can be anything from baby blue to royal. I will have a pattern for everyone at the conclusion of the exchange and you will see how well these fabrics will work for it. "Pure" colours are those that have been printed on a white base. Further explanation can be found on our website. I will have samples available at the meetings. I'm sure, without realizing it, many of you already know the difference between white and brown based fabrics as evidenced by the beautiful quilts we see at our Show & Share. As we will not be having "in person" meetings for the months of January, February, and March,
