
















### SHOW NEWS

### A Bullet Pulling Thread:

I'm writing to you from JAYU, a charity that shares human rights stories through the arts. Our year-round programs include the JAYU Human Rights Film Festival+ and iAM - an arts and social justice training program for youth.

I'm reaching out to tell you about A Bullet Pulling Thread. It's a story about a quilter named Marilyn Farquhar from Kitchener who goes on an artistic journey after her brother is shot by the RCMP outside of Lytton, BC. Last year Marilyn and her quilts were also featured as part of Houston's International Quilt Expo.

We would like to invite you and your guild to come see our film next week at the JAYU Human Rights Film Festival+ in Toronto on Thursday, December 7th at the Bloor Hot Docs Cinema at 6:30 PM.

Marilyn will be there with her Kairos quilts in person, so you will have a chance to see her art after her Q&A.

After our last screening, one person shared a note with Marilyn which read "I just wanted to say how amazed and inspired I am by you. Your heart for justice and for others is astounding and rare." Another viewer shared: "I, and I believe everyone else that was there that night, was deeply moved by your film. The sensitivity towards its subjects and its fair and honest storytelling, gripped me and my friends who sat next to me."

So this is a documentary best experienced live--it's communal. It's cathartic. It's dealing with the tragedies we hear about on the news everyday. And maybe might spark us to maa change.

If possible, can you invite your Guild--and share our trailer and poster below on any quilting newsletters, websites, or Facebook pages (See image attached). We would love to have you out. Marilyn is a Quilter through and through and a member of several guilds in Ontario.

### Synopsis:

Can quilting change the world? In January 2020, the RCMP killed homeless rights activist Barry Shantz at his home in Lytton, B.C. during a mental health crisis. That morning, his partner called 911 for help. What they got was an army of police officers, but not a single mental health worker. In response to this tragedy, his sister Marilyn Farquhar creates a series of art quilts titled Kairos to process her grief and share her story.

### **CQA News:**

I have just returned from travelling abroad and found this trip very educational on many different levels. Who knew that so many of our quilt patterns were present in architectural details from many centuries ago? The Cueva Pintada Museum & Archaeological Park in Gran Canaria is an active archaeological site with ancient indigenous cave paintings. Geometric shapes were used to express rituals or calendars; it is believed. What I was seeing were half square triangles in red, black, or white pigments. I also visited the National Museum of the Azulejo in Lisbon, Portugal. Azulejo is the art of creating the tiles that are everywhere in Portugal. This artform began in Seville, Spain. The tiles are usually 5"-6" square. The

making of the tiles, placement, griding etc. was well explained and it reminded me of how we set up our blocks & their placement in our quilts too. Colour combinations depended on the natural materials available to create the paints. Looking at blues, yellows and whites reminded me of what we now often call "French Country". The tiles I was looking at were from the 14th - 16thC. Again, elements of Ohio Stars, Churn Dash, and geometric shadow style square patterns were present. As quilters, we look at things with a different lens. When I taught a novice learn to quilt course I always found it rewarding when my students would start to share how they could "see" the way quilt blocks were pieced based on the skills they were learning in my class. They were starting to break down the quilts from the images that they were looking at. This is what I was doing in my travels. The CQA website is having new information added frequently so continue to check for updates. Hotels have been added as well as the bios of workshop instructor's, lecturers are now available. Early bird registration for members with a 10% discount will be Feb. 2 nd - March 5th, 2024. General public registration begins March 6th, 2024. Trend Tex Challenge Kits There are still kits available for the Trend Tex Challenge. I have kits available for purchase, \$25.00 members, \$35.00 non-members. This will save you the shipping and tax. If you live in Durham Region, we could arrange to meet prior to Dec. 9th otherwise order your kit from the website. Save the dates June 19-22, 2024, for Quilt Canada Edmonton. Youth Challenge There are kits available for the Youth Challenge. Perhaps you would like to mentor a young person in your community. I would be more than happy to sponsor the child as a CQA member is required to sponsor the entrant if the mentor isn't a member. CQA Rosette Invitational Returns Planning a quilt show next year? Remember to apply for your CQA Rosette. It can be awarded to Best of Show or Viewers Choice. Be sure to take a picture of the winning quilt with the award AND the quilter. Upload to the CQA website to participate in the Guild Rosette Invitational. All three (3) items must be in the photo to qualify for the invitational. CQA Mystery Quilt Along 2024 Oatmeal Raisin Kathryn Wilson Tucker from Next Steps Quilt Designs has designed our newest Mystery Quilt for 2024. The fabric requirements are now available. New clues (patterns) will be released on the 3 rd Friday of each month until June. Level of difficulty is for beginners. Perhaps there are some novice quilters who are new to your guild? This might be an excellent project to carry one through the winter and spring. And it's FREE! Final Remarks Thank-you to the quilt guilds who have graciously forwarded me their newsletters. I hope that other quilt guilds will consider adding me to their email to help me see what's going on in my region and how I can help. Perhaps you will consider inviting me to do a presentation to your guild? Many of you will be moving to ZOOM for the winter months and I would be more than happy to be invited to speak to your guild.
