
Sharon M. borrowed Farm Girl Vintage 2 by Lori Holt from our guild's library. Look at the charming and cheerful quilt that she made!

For those of you who make completed quilts for our program, we would be pleased to provide you with a label to add to the quilt when you are attaching the binding. Every quilt that is distributed to our community partners must have one of our labels on it before it's handed out. It would help us a lot to have the label attached before the quilt is handed in so we can turn them around faster to our community partners. We truly appreciate our member supporting our program.

Kudo Strips - are a way to share a celebratory event in your life with the guild. As "payment" for this, please bring a wof x 2 1/2-inch strip of fabric. Traditionally at our guild, these 'payments' were given to the President in order that they can make a quilt for community outreach or a donation quilt. Years ago, we upgraded this process so not to put the pressure on the President to make a quilt when they became Past President and all the 'strip payments' went directly to Community Outreach. These strips help Community Outreach in that we too, share in your good fortune. You share your good news story, and we make good use of your 'payment'. It's a win-win!

If you have come forward with a Kudo to share at the guild in the last year and have forgotten your 'fabric payment', your Community Outreach team will be collecting at the April 2024 in-person meeting. You can simply drop off your 'arrears payment' at our table and we there will be no questions asked, and no judgements will be made. - 1) Get ready for the Quilt show Challenge. Diana S will again explain the challenge at the Guild meeting. The challenge will start in January. Full written details will be shared at the January meeting and will be housed on the website. The Show Challenge is a juried challenge!
- 2) The "Get it done... UFO" activity has 30 members eagerly awaiting the spinner to see if 2,3,5 or 6 will be the February Get It Done Project. Note: You will have to take a picture of your finished project and send it in to Jacqueline (see membership listing for email) for the March Meeting (It will be due by 9 am the day of the meeting), and remember to send it into show and share for the slideshow as well:)
- 3) As we enjoy our remote Guild meetings don't forget to work on your Boutique kits.

DTQG Celebration of Quilting 2024

Quilt Show Challenge

Each person who enters the Challenge will demonstrate their quilting skills as they "celebrate" themselves.

Each quilter is to use their three initials (first, middle and last name OR first, maiden and married name), in whatever order they choose.

One initial will be the main (50%) colour of your project.

One initial will be the pattern / block used.

One initial will be the quilting style / motif used.

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Example: Diana Elizabeth Smith

E - emerald green as the main colour

D - Dresden plate as the block pattern

S - a stippling stitch as the quilting style

Size limitations: minimum - 12" x 18"

maximum - 24" x 36"

Entry fee: \$10.00

Prizes: 1st place, 60% of entry fees / 2nd place, 30% of entry fees / 3rd place, 10% of entry fees.

Start date: January 2024

Submission deadline: September 30th, 2024 at 5 pm.

(If you are unable to submit your entry at the September Guild meeting, please call Diana S. to arrange for drop off).

Regardless, it is the winter when I do most of my quilting. How about you? Although I am currently in Central Florida, it too has had a lousy winter; cold, wet, overcast. We have just turned the heat off a few days ago that has been on since before Christmas!

I also am a dressmaker and I have been sewing both garments and new quilt tops. I recently went to a quilt show in Lakeland, FL. There were 200 quilts on display in a variety of categories and this was a juried show. Although in the minority, there were still several quilts that were hand quilted which was lovely to see. I was very naughty checking out the vendors... some good deals were found.

Is your quilt guild having a show this year? If so, do apply for a Guild Rosette from CQA. Application forms are on the CQA website. The Guild Rosette Invitational has returned; therefore, remember to submit a photograph of your winner with their quilt and Rosette award by December 31st, 2024. Your guild can email me your show information so that I can forward it to other Guilds in my Region to help

promote it. Many quilters love to be inspired by fellow quilters, as well as add new fabrics to their stash from the vendors.

Ouilt Canada. Edmonton

Edmonton will be hosting this year's Quilt Canada June 19-22. If you are a CQA member, advance registration is available February 20^{th} - March 5^{th} , 2024. Registration for the General Public will open March 6^{th} , 2024. There are many exciting workshops and lecturers which you can check out on the CQA website. This is a wonderful opportunity to expand your quilting skills.
