## President's Message:

Good day fellow quilters. We are heading into the last meeting of the current guild year (Monday June 10), at which we will hold our Annual General Meeting. As we are not revising the constitution this year, the email notification of the AGM does not have to be sent out 14 days in advance of the meeting. A few days before the meeting, however, we will still send out an email with the formal notice of meeting for the AGM, containing an agenda for the meeting, the financial income and expenses report for the last-reviewed guild year (2022-2023) and the proposed list of volunteers for the new Executive for the 2024-2025 guild year (for acceptance/voting). As of the time of writing of this newsletter article, we are still in need of people to fill in some key volunteer positions – please see the article from the Past President, later in this newsletter.

Members will be required to sign in as they enter for this meeting, due to the AGM. Members coming for the catered dinner will be asked to sign in when they arrive for dinner (please arrive at 5:15 as dinner is served at 5:30). To allow our volunteers time to eat their dinner without interruptions, between 5:30 and 6:45 pm we will be blocking entry for people who are not attending the dinner. At 6:45 pm, when the dinner is finished, the volunteers will head to the signin location and entry for non-dining members can begin. Note that if you do not attend the dinner and you arrive before 6:45 pm, you will have to wait in the lobby until the volunteers get set up to sign in attending members. As there is likely to be a line up, please be patient with everyone while

we execute this sign-in process. The volunteer running the Zoom connection to our meeting will sign in anyone who is attending virtually via Zoom.

Assuming that the executive is voted in, and all guild Officer positions are filled (because we cannot have a guild without all Officer positions filled), our next guild year (2024-2025) will officially start on July 1. The on-line registration for the new year will open on the website starting July 1. This registration form will contain some information to clarify fines for lost library books and we are thinking of including a basic code of conduct for members. As the wording hasn't been fully worked out yet (I want the executive to approve it before we put it in the registration), I'm not including the code's details in this message, but it will be along the lines of "be kind, be considerate, etc." Note that we will not be accepting payment or registration for the new guild year prior to July 1, to help simplify the year-by-year accounting. Later in the summer, an email will go out to all 2023-2024 guild year members, with a reminder to register on-line and a request that you please pay your membership fee by e-transfer if at all possible (this will reduce the line at the September Membership desk). E-transfers should be sent to the guild email: dtqguild@gmail.com.

For the guild's summer activities, as done last summer, the guild will allow participation by registered members from the previous guild year as well as people who have registered for the new guild year (2024-2025).

A little kindness goes a long way. It's unfortunately been obvious lately that this is sometimes easy to forget. Let's work together to continue to share our passion for our craft in friendly atmosphere that we can all enjoy and feel part of.

Positions I have received a volunteer for: Secretary, Social, Membership, Membership Assistant, Program, Retreats/Special Events

#### Still Require a volunteer:

**Vice President** - One of the positions needing to be filled (an Officers position and an essential one for us to continue on as a Guild) is the position of Vice President. Being Vice president is a 6

year commitment. 2 years as Vice, 2 years as President and 2 years as Past President. The roles are not onerous, but they are very important.

As Vice you assist the President and basically have a 2 year apprenticeship for the role of President. As President you guide the Executive to create a Guild that follows the constitution to have an active and inspiring quilting experience for all. You are part of a large and cooperative team which takes a huge load off your shoulders. Laura has also created many good templates during her time as President. This will help the new President run the Executive and Guild meetings smoothly and easily. Laura will also be there to help for another 2 years as Past President.

It is essential that we have someone become Vice President as without that position filled we can not continue as a Guild. I am hoping by letting you know early in the year you will think about stepping forward and accepting the position as the Vice President.

Show and Share - Peggy has done an excellent job with quite the learning curve for her. Peggy has completed her term and is looking to have a break so she can be a regular member for a bit.

Show and Share convenor enables us to share our projects with others either in person or online. For our online meetings the Show and Share convenor creates a PowerPoint from the pictures submitted from members before the due date (usually 5 days before our regular Guild meeting) and runs it at the appropriate time. If you are cautious about creating a PowerPoint presentation there are many here in the Guild who can walk you through this and help you to be very successful at it. At our in person meetings the convenor organizes the herd of cats into a line and helps to showcase the creations that are being shared with us. Recruiting volunteers to help with holding the quilts is an easy part of the task because those of us holding the quilts get a great close up view.

Publicity – This is a position that is front loaded in the year. You would be responsible for contacting current, previous, and new businesses that would be interested in advertising in our newsletter for the year. Most of the work is done in September and October (by email mostly) and the businesses pay by e-transfer. Big part of the work is writing emails to the businesses and then sending out an invoice after they have paid.

Executive meetings are usually done on Zoom so travel is at a minimum for all. And it is easy to get into your PJ's right after the meeting for some. Or get some sewing time in for others. The time commitment varies for the different roles and there is always somebody willing to step forward and give you a hand when you need it.

To continue as a Guild we must have a Vice President. If this position is not filled then the next year will be focused on the tasks required to dissolve the guild and parcel out our inventory and resources to other community groups.

Well, as you can see, there are many opportunities for you to step up and help on the Executive. The Executive is excited about having some new people come forward and fill these positions because you bring new ideas, great skills and a wonderful energy to add to the existing cadre of wonderful people. Our goal is to have the most fun and productive Guild that we can be. That can only happen with members who volunteer and step into these roles so we can continue being a Guild that has a great influence in our community.

## Fabric Exchange 2023-2024

#### Hello fellow quilters:

For 2024-2025, the exchange will be for 2-1/2" strips of quilting quality fabric. I am asking for "toned" colours, as explained below. Any shade of the colour is acceptable. You will need 6 strips each month starting in October and ending in April (a total of 42 strips). At the conclusion I will give you a pattern to make a lap size quilt and also some alternative designs you can use with these fabrics.

The exchange will work as follows: Each month you will hand in 6 of the 2-1/2" strips in the colour indicated for the month. All 6 strips do not have to be the same fabric. You will get back 6 strips of that colour, in a variety of fabrics - the more people who participate the greater the variety. As some



colours are not terribly popular, in February and April you will have the choice of two colours.

Please put your strips in a plastic bag with your name and phone number written on the front. As we will not be having "in person" meetings for the months of January, February and March, you will hand them in at the December meeting and receive them back in April.


