

The colours for this exchange are as follows:

October - Gold

November - Blue

December - Red

January - Green

February - Brown or Black

March - Cheddar

April - Aubergine or Pink

You will notice some of the months give you alternative colours e.g. Brown or Black can be 6 of one colour or 4 brown and 2 black. I've done this because it's sometimes hard to find some colours.

I hope you will participate in this program - it's fun - it's free - and you will learn to identify toned fabrics.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH – Kate H. Carolyn L., Sharon L., Diane W., Diane D., Dorothy M.

Good day Quilters from your Community Outreach Committee.

The Committee's focus is to use supplies on hand to have members complete quilts that are then donated to various agencies in the Durham region. This fulfills our guild's aim to participate in community projects.

A free, or very inexpensive, location for our members to curate our supplies into kits is needed. Ideally, a large room with 8-10 tables, available on the weekend for a full day. We need space to empty dozens of bins and turn them into supplies our guild members can turn into quilts. Do you, your partner, or someone you know, have access to space that would be suitable and available once every 2-3 months? Contact Kate with any ideas or options. Much appreciated.

We need to track the quilts made. Please allow us time to set-up before handing in ANYTHING at the meetings. Also, we need to have anyone who takes a kit out to complete the tag before it is returned. Did you piece the top, quilt, bind, etc.? If it's on the tag, we can track your great work.

We would like to thank Angie S., Debbie K., and Diana S. for their large quilt store quality cotton fabric donations last month.

Do you have a kit sitting at home that despite your best intentions you know you won't get to by end of March? Bring it back and someone else may take it home! No shame. No judgment. Only love!

Please note that if quilt tops are donated by members (made with their own fabrics), the smaller ones will be completed with the supplies the guild has on hand. Larger quilts will be donated to Quilts of Valour or Quilts for Survivors, as flimsies, as they have resources to have them completed. Keep in mind that a large quilt costs almost \$100 to complete.

Last month, DTQG donated 75 placemats to Meals on Wheels Clarington, and 150 to the Whitby division. Are you keeping track? That's 225 placemats made by our members! Way to go Quilters! Keep making them. As we fill boxes, we'll drop them off where needed.

A large donation of fleece was received from Anne A. earlier in the year. It was turned into scarves and they were donated to Ignite Durham, an agency that supports DDSB students and their families.

This month we will be delivering quilts to Muslim Welfare Homes, the Pregnancy Help Centre, Fairview Lodge Whitby, Thorntonview Long Term Care and the Region of Durham Homeless Shelter at 1635 Dundas Street in Whitby. We have reached out to other agencies in anticipation of more completed quilts coming our way.

Take a look at the photos of some of our recent quilt submissions in the newsletter and on the website.

Please take the time to visit our corner at the December meeting and take a kit or two out. If you know of a charity that would benefit from receiving quilts, placemats, walker bags, or a quilt for raffle, please email the guild.




