President's Challenge

We have decided to run a President's challenge this year.

The cost to participate is \$5 per entry. The funds collected will cover the prizes. Sign up is available on the website (https://durhamtrilliumquiltersguild.ca/presidents-challenge). There is no limit on the # of entries per person.

The President's challenge for this guild year is to make a quilt based on a song of your choice. Guidelines are as follows:

- The quilt you make is to be inspired by a song of your choice. It can be a favourite song, a song that is motivational, part of a song's lyrics that mean something to you / inspire you, your "hanging onto sanity in traffic" car song, or any other song you want.
- The quilt can use an established design or pattern or be original, but it should be done in such a way that the finished item clearly demonstrations the interpretation / inspiration of the song of your choosing.
- Minimum dimension is 12 inches.
- Maximum dimension is 36 inches.
- Quilt must be finished, bound, and have a label. Please cover the label prior to submission. If the label is not covered, a cover will be put over the label before judging.

Quilts for the challenge are to be submitted at the May in-person meeting. If unable to attend the May meeting to submit your quilt, please either have a friend bring it to the meeting or contact the Vice President or Past President for other options.

Submitted quilts will be judged by the President and winners will be presented at the June meeting.

Past President's Update

Hello fellow quilters. Here are a couple of updates on guild business:

VICE PRESIDENT

As many of you are aware, the Vice President who was elected at the 2024 June meeting has resigned from the position, due to changes in her work that would not allow her to properly participate or fulfil her role. A review of the constitution found that we do not have to have a full election for a vacant executive position, as Article V item 5 indicates: Resignations from the Executive must be submitted in writing to the President. The Executive may appoint a replacement to serve the unexpired term. We thank the 2 people who volunteered to help out for the term position: Debbie K. and Lyne M. At the February Executive meeting, the executive voted and Debbie K. has been appointed to fulfil the Vice President position for the remainder of the term (ending 2026 June 30). Following this term, Debbie will not proceed to become the President – she is there for this term only. For the next term, a new Vice President and President will be elected. Several people with past experience as President have indicated a willingness to be President for the next term, to allow the guild to proceed without issue and to assist any new Vice President to learn the role, as needed.

CONSTITUTION REVIEW

Thank you to people who volunteered, and we now have our constitution review committee. The committee is made up of the following Executive members: Debbie W., Laura B., Jacqueline H., and Kate H. and the following members at large: Gerlinde C. and Joanne N. The committee will review the constitution (last modified 2022 June) and advise the executive of any changes we feel are required. We will also be reviewing if a code of conduct should be added to the constitution. If any changes are recommended, once any voted on and approved by the Executive, the revised constitution will be provided to the membership at least 14 days in advance of the Annual General Meeting to be held at our June guild meeting.



Our committee will be making plans for the upcoming Community Outreach in-person sew days, Saturday June 8 and Sunday June 9, 2025.

Members are invited to get together and work on projects for Community Outreach at that time. Our sew day will be held at Lake Vista Community Centre, 450 Emerald Avenue, Oshawa L1J 1K4. We will be working from 10-5 on Saturday and 10-3 on Sunday. You can sign up for one day, two days, a few hours whatever you are available for. Your help is appreciated.

We have received several donations of printed cotton fabric and are looking for good quality quilting cotton in neutrals (white, cream, beige or light gray) to supplement these printed fabrics. If you have some fabrics, fat quarter size and larger, we would be happy to take that off your hands. Please bring it to the April in-person meeting. If you've been participating in an annual de-clutter challenge, keep us in mind for your donations of fabric. For smaller pieces of fabric please drop them off with the fabric basket team.

The Committee's focus is to use supplies on hand to have our members complete quilts that are then donated to various agencies in the Durham region. This fulfills our guild's aim to participate in community projects.

It's already March and hope that you have completed any projects signed out from us. We look forward to receiving lots of completed items at the next in-person meeting. Remember to complete the tracking tag. For those of you who enjoy making outreach projects with your own fabric please provide the size of your quilt by attaching a paper label with a SAFETY pin indicating those important details.

Do you need any labels for items you are making on your own? Please contact me to make arrangements to drop them off. I am home most evenings after 5 p.m. Porch pick up or drop off is available. 
