Hello fellow quilters!

This newsletter continues our description of the volunteer positions on the guild executive that need to be filled for 2026-2027. I also still need a guild member who is not part of the executive to help me talk to guild members about filling roles on the Executive. If you are willing to help, please contact me by email (or by emailing the guild at dtqguild@gmail.com).

We are confident that our guild members have the skills and energy to fill these positions and allow us to continue to run an excellent quilt guild. Consider joining a supportive team of like-minded individuals to lead the guild into the upcoming years.

Below is a list of the positions that need to be filled. Per our constitution, officers must have been a member in good standing for at least 12 months, and to be another executive position, you must have been a member in good standing for at least 8 months. Please consider volunteering for the executive so that our wonderful guild can keep running!

- President (Officer)
- Vice President (Officer)
- Secretary (Officer)
- Treasurer (Officer)
- Program
- Membership (A volunteer has come forward for this position)
- Library
- Retreats
- Workshops
- Publicity/Advertising
- Mystery / BOM
- Community Outreach
- Fabric Basket
- Technology

In the last 2 newsletter I included “job descriptions” for the positions of President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Program, Library, Retreats, and Workshop. This month’s newsletter contains descriptions for Publicity/Advertising, Mystery/BOM, Community Outreach, Fabric Basket, and Technology.

Publicity/Advertising:

This convenor is responsible for managing the guild’s publicity and advertising. Early in each guild year, the convenor will be responsible to contact businesses that advertise on our website and newsletter and ask if they would like to continue to advertise with us. The convenor may also approach other businesses, as desired. The convenor will provide a list of advertisers for the new year, and any new or changed advertising material to the newsletter and website convenors. The convenor is also responsible to manage publicity for the guild, which has included placing free ads in local online and print newspapers. How this is done will be up to the convenor, with input from the executive available as needed. This is a voting position on the executive.

Mystery/BOM:

This convenor is responsible for managing the guild's block of the month or mystery quilt program. The convenor will decide whether to run a Block of the Month or a Mystery Quilt program, and will pick an appropriate pattern to be followed. The convenor will manage sign up of guild members (collecting a fee if required / desired for prizes) and then, for each month that the program is run, the convenor will send out instructions to the participants on the block / pattern parts to construct that month. This is a voting position on the executive.

Community Outreach:

This convenor is responsible for managing the guild's "cuddle quilt" and community outreach program. This convenor, with a team to assist, is responsible for arranging quilts to be made and donated, and presenting donated quilts to Durham organizations in need of quilts. This may involve taking fabric that has been donated, supplementing with purchased fabric and batting per the budget, and putting together kits for creating a quilt top and/or creating binding, and making kits with completed quilt tops, batting and backing to be quilted, and kits for completed tops to be bound. The community outreach team will track which guild members have taken a kit, and which have returned their kits. Donated items are photographed and information on the donations and the photographs are provided to the newsletter and website convenors. The convenor (not the whole team) is a voting position on the executive.

Fabric Basket:

This convenor is responsible for managing the guild's donated scrap fabric. At each in-person guild meeting, the convenor will set out the scraps of fabric (no smaller than a wide open hand) that have already been donated by members, so that during the meeting, other members may take the scraps as desired. During the meeting, members may drop off more scraps to the collection. This is NOT a voting position on the executive.

Technology:

This convenor is responsible for assisting guild convenors with technology. This involves managing the Zoom aspects of the guild meetings (both hybrid meetings that are in-person and virtual, and virtual-only meetings in the winter). The convenor does not have to have a paid Zoom plan – if a volunteer cannot be found to donate meeting times, then the budget can cover a guild Zoom meeting. The technology convenor also sets up forms for convenors as needed (e.g., forms to sign up for a program, forms to get information for a survey, etc.) (the convenors are to provide all the information that is to go on the forms) and will provide spreadsheet summaries of the responses to the applicable convenor as requested. This is a voting position on the executive.

Let me know what executive positions you are willing to lend your skills and enthusiasm to!

2025 - 2026 DTQG President's Challenge

The President's Challenge continues with the "postcard quilt" theme. You may join the challenge anytime, so long as you can have your mini postcard quilt finished and turned in to the Past President (Laura B) by the May guild meeting. The cost to participate is \$5 per entry. There is no limit on the number of entries per person, but there can be no more than 50 entries in total (the total # of post card backings purchased).

You can sign up on the website (<https://durhamtrilliumquiltersguild.ca/presidents-challenge>) noting that since our next few meetings are virtual, you will have to coordinate with Laura to get the postcard backing for your challenge quilt.

The challenge for this guild year is to make a miniature postcard-sized quilt. Guidelines are as follows:

- The quilt can use an established design/pattern or be an original.
- The required dimension are exactly 4 inches by 6 inches (to fit the backing card).
- The quilt may be in either portrait or landscape orientation.
- There must be quilting (minimum is a front and batting quilted before being attached to postcard). You do not need to quilt through the postcard backing.
- A 4" x 6" post-card backing (with typical postcard lines/info) will be provided to you. This must be attached to the back of the miniature quilt that you submit.
 - The method of attachment is up to you – binding, fancy stitching, etc.
- No label is needed on the completed post-card.

To coordinate receiving your post-card backing, and the paper to fill out and return when submitting your quilted postcard for judging, contact Laura B by emailing her or emailing the guild (dtqguild@gmail.com) (and then our lovely secretary will forward it to me).

Quilts for the challenge are to be submitted to Laura B. and must be submitted before the end of the May in-person guild meeting. Please submit inside the bag provided, along with the completed quilt information submission form.

If unable to attend the May meeting to submit your quilt, please either have a friend bring it to the May meeting or contact Laura B. for other options.

Submitted quilts will be judged by the President and winners will be presented at the June meeting, when all submitted postcard quilts will be displayed (and then returned).

Card Workshop Survey



The days are getting longer! We are almost done the Zoom portion of the guild year. If anyone is looking for a top to assemble, quilt or bind, please reach out to Kate H., and I will get something ready for you to pick up. Please remember to complete the tag portion on any of our kits. Measurements are especially helpful, and remember, no straight pins!

A reminder of our current programs for this year:

- **Community Care – Meals on Wheels** Placemats : 12" x 16" is the preferred completed size
- **Comfy Cases** Pillowcases (hot dog type are super easy)
- **Quilts of Valour**: We will gladly accept completed tops with binding, and completed quilts on their behalf. Ensure they meet their size criteria (minimum size 50 x 70,

maximum size 60 x 80) and include binding fabric with your quilt top. For more information on the Quilts of Valour program, visit their website:

- **Quilts for Survivors:** We will accept quilt tops with binding on your behalf. They have no minimum or maximum sizes, however, they do have specific criteria about the types of fabric patterns they would like in the quilt tops created for the Survivors. For information on that, please visit their website at <https://www.quiltsforsurvivors.ca> check out their 'contribute' page for details.
- **The Pregnancy Help Centre** has asked for flannel receiving blankets and bibs if you have some time to make either of these, we will make the delivery. We support them with quilts as well, and they are so very grateful for the beautiful items they receive from us.
- **Lakeridge Health NICU** unit is looking for isolette covers and flannel receiving blankets as well. The size they are looking for is roughly 40" x 44". We will facilitate a drop off after the October meeting. As a mom of a preemie baby born at LHO, I know firsthand how well these are cherished.

If you are participating in a declutter challenge and cleaning your sewing room, we will always accept neutral yardage to go along with the wonderful fabric donations we have on hand.

Some members often make completed quilts which is totally awesome and we love those. Please ensure your name and the size of the quilt is provided when you hand it in at the meeting. Ask for a label anytime at the meeting. Ideally, labels should be sewn into the binding before handing in to us.

We look forward to seeing everyone in person in April, and virtually at the March meeting!


