





# Harrison has won an amazing 16 LGA titles

#### By JOHN PRICE

When it comes to winning Louisiana Golf Association titles since 2004, no one has come close to what Julie Harrison has accomplished.

The Baton Rouge resident has 16 LGA titles and has won the last five Senior Amateur titles. She has won a record eight total Louisiana Golf Association Senior Amateur titles with wins in 2011-2013 as well.

In addition to her 11 individual championships (2004 Women's State Amateur, 2008 and 2020 Mid-Amateur), she has partnered up to win five LWGA (they merged with the LGA recently) Four-Ball titles. The last one in 2016 was with Mary Lynn Stuart at Koasati Pines Golf Course at Coushatta in Kinder.

"She's a great golfer but a greater person," said Stuart, who has finished second to Harrison four times in the last five years at the LGA Senior Amateur . "It's pretty amazing she has won 16 LGA titles. She is very fun to be around and makes everyone feel welcomed. I'm always pulling for her unless I'm playing against her. She deserves everything she has accomplished and works hard at getting better and better."

Stuart, a former teaching professional that got her amateur status back in 2001, met Harrison 20 years ago at Olde Oaks Golf Club (Haughton, La.) at a LWGA event. The two have been friends since then and even won a Tri-State title together defeating teams from Arkansas and Mississippi.

Harrison picked up the game of golf when she was 30 and it was 14 years later before she won her first state title. Julie's husband is a former LSU golf coach and got her into the game. She also watched and spent lots of time around the collegiate golfers that husband Britt coached. It was there that she really learned about the game of golf through watching the players practice and play.

"Looking back, if I hadn't met Britt I'd probably be just a weekend golfer," Julie Harrison said.



She is much more than that. Harrison plays all the LGA events, has competed in 20 USGA events, including the 2019 Women's U.S. Senior Open. She can be found playing several times a week at her home club — The Country Club of Louisiana. She has been a member at CCL since 1992 and played golf all over meeting lots of different people. One of Harrison's recent playing partners came to mind when I sat down with her at CCL for a lunch meeting back in December.

"One of the things I've really enjoyed is playing golf with so many different people over the years," Julie said. "Just recently, I really enjoyed playing and competing with a 13-year-old young lady from Denham Springs (Sophia Macias)."

Macias and Harrison battled back-and-forth at the BREC Women's Baton Rouge Open at Webb Memorial

Golf Course (Baton Rouge) in late October. Macias and Harrison played to a tie after 36 holes of regulation and although Macias won the title in the playoff, Harrison made quite an impression on her.

"She had a great attitude about everything," Macias recalled. "She was very kind and never let any bad shots get her down. She is very determined and had an amazing attitude. What she has accomplished is impressive. She deserves it all."

Harrison has a personal goal to get better and better each year. The retired high-school teacher and coach is always preparing to get better and loves the game of golf.

"I love having the opportunity to play golf all over. I'm not stopping at all," Harrison said. "There are times I'll come home from a tournament and then go practice to get or improve a certain kind of shot I didn't have."

Harrison was born in the Beaumont, Texas area. Growing up, she was a state championship swimmer and standout volleyball and softball player while growing up in the Houston area.

She married Britt in 1992. He coached LSU for 10 years (1988-1998) and led the Tigers to 16 tournament titles. Britt was an All-American golfer and National Champion at Oklahoma State.

Julie has recorded a hole-in-one eight times (five of them at CCL) and her personal best round is a 67 (best round in competition was a 70 at Koasati Pines). Her average drive is 230-240 yards, which is impressive for someone that is turning 61 in May.

Harrison used LaBauve Golf to keep her game intact and allows her to continue improving. Mike and Sandy LaBauve both played for LSU and now teach out of Arizona and Colorado as they split time depending on the weather in those two states.

"They are great people and really great teachers," Harrison said. "I still work hard on my game and my health. My goal is to get better each year so I can keep this run going."



## Zurich Classic slated for April 22-25

This year's PGA Tour's Zurich Classic of New Orleans is scheduled for April 22-25 at TPC Louisiana in Avondale.

As of press time, a decision has not been made whether fans will be allowed, but it is likely a certain amount will be allowed as some recent PGA Tour events are planned with a limited amount of spectators. The Zurich Classic of New Orleans website (www.zurichgolfclassic.com) is currently selling spectator passes and packages.

Last year's tournament was cancelled marking the first time since 1958 a PGA Tour event was not held in New Orleans. The Crescent City first held a PGA Tour event in 1938 when Harry Cooper shot a 285 to win the Crescent City Open at City Park Golf Course.

This year's Zurich Classic of New Orleans will



start on Monday with a pro-am at 11 am.

Tuesday will feature professional practice rounds and another pro-am will take place on Wednesday. The first round starts on Thursday and is scheduled to end on Sunday. The Golf Channel will provide coverage all four rounds with CBS having

coverage from 2pm-5pm on the final two days.

Jon Rahm and teammate Ryan Palmer (2019 champs) will return to defend their championship in the PGA Tour's only official team event.

Since 1958, the Fore!Kids Foundation has been running the lone PGA Tour stop in New Orleans.

Last year despite not having the tourney, the organization was still able to donate over \$1.5 million to local and regional charities with Zurich Insurance playing a huge role in the ability distribute those funds.

## Renovations complete at Tamahka Trails GC

The renovations were done by Mississippi's Nathan Crace, a golf-course architect that designed Copper Mill Golf Club (Zachary, La.) and is a member of the ASGCA (American Society of Golf Course Architects).

"Tamahka Trails is the best kept secret in golf in the state of Louisiana," said Crace.

"There simply is no piece of property in the southern part of the state that has the unique typography and feel that this property has. Now with these new upgrades it should be on everyone's must-play list, regardless of skill level. It's



always a thrill to be part of a project like this. From the owner, to the staff to the contractor, everyone was on board from the beginning and supported what needed to be done 100 percent."

The main aspect of this renovation was the overhaul of the course's bunkers. Tamahka Trails has been unable to host the top state amateur golf tournaments for many years due to the condition of the course's bunkers. This

renovation included replacing all drain lines and sand, shaping the bunker complex to eliminate steep slopes, converting roughly 40,000 square feet of bunkers to grass, strategically adding small pot bunkers to four holes and implementing the Better Billy Bunker system to improve drainage and better protect

the bunkers. Additionally, some other updates and changes have been made like the addition of a practice green and

chipping bunker, a new set of tees installed measuring around 4,000 yards (recommended by the USGA for juniors and beginners), more tee boxes and repositioning the standard men's tees, new championship tees added on seven holes (adding more than 150 yards to the length of the course), upgrades to the fairway and cart paths and new and improved landscaping throughout the course and surrounding club house and parking lot.

The Paragon Casino Resort and the golf course are owned by the Tunica Biloxi Tribe of Louisiana.

"We are impressed with the beautiful renovation of the Tamahka Trails Golf Club and believe that golfers and visitors to the course will be too," said Tunica-Biloxi Tribal Chairman Marshall Pierite. 
There are also a couple of well-known amateur tours in Louisiana that have already secured their dates with the golf course for large tournaments.

## Four receive Player of Year Awards from LGA

The Louisiana Golf Association announced its Player of the Year Awards recently to John Humphries, Lauren Aillet, Robby McWilliams and Julie Harrison.

Humphries, the LGA Amateur Champion, edged out Eli Ortego (Broussard) by only five points. Humphries (Woodworth) will have a chance to win his third straight title in July at Squire Creek Country Club in Choudrant.



Aillet (Lafayette)

captured her fist LGA Women's Player of the Year title in dramatic fashion. Aillet won by 7.5 points over Harrison (Baton Rouge) and Catherine Hodson (Baton Rouge).

Aillet and partner Christina Popp (Lafayette) finished tied for second at the Women's Four-Ball Championship, which earned her 57.5 points. Aillet also finished second at the Women's Mid-Amateur Championship, which gave her 85 points and secured her Player of the Year title.

McWilliams (Benton) captured his second straight Senior POY title. He earned 75 points more than Bart Dornier (Metairie). McWilliams was successful in defending both of his 2019 championships. He and partner Rod Baronet, who finished fourth in the POY race, won the Senior Four-Ball Championship. McWilliams also won the Senior Amateur Championship.

Harrison captured her second consecutive Women's Senior Player of the Year. She made it to the Round of 16 at the Louisiana Women's Amateur Championship, won the Women's Senior Amateur Championship and the Women's Mid-Amateur Championship. Harrison has now won an amazing 16 Louisiana Golf Association Championships in her career.

#### **HESTER PASSES AWAY AFTER BATTLE WITH CANCER**

Kathy Hester, whose passion for golf and in particular women's golf, passed away on Jan. 9 after a five-year battle with cancer.

Hester was born in Jena, La. on April 30, 1952. She was a Class A LPGA Teaching professional at Selman Field Golf Course (Monroe, La.), Riverside Golf Course (West Monroe, La.), Boeuf River Country Club (Rayville, La.) and Clear Creek Golf Club (Vicksburg, Miss.) before opening her own Guaranteed Golf School in Vicksburg.

She was a pioneer for female golf in Mississippi as she was instrumental in the state getting girls high-school golf in the early 2000s.





## CourseScout starting its national footprint in LA/MS

When it comes to photos and videos from the golf course, drone footage is where it is at and CourseScout is at the forefront of this media frenzy in a unique way.

The Atlanta-based company was co-founded by Matt Jones and Nicole Kato. Jones is an FAA licensed drone pilot and a former Navy Aircrewman. Kato is married to an Air Force pilot. The two met through Bunker Labs, which allows military veterans to resources that help grow their businesses. That was August 2019 and by Jan. 2020, the two were charging ahead with the vision of the young company.

Kato used to work for Disney writing hospitality software for the worldwide conglomerate. Jones has spent the majority of his civilian career in the world of digital audience engagement working with major media companies.

CourseScout is described as a mobile-friendly Video Marketing and Content Management business. The first concept was jotted down by Jones on a napkin. Tee to Green Golf Magazine Publisher John Price came on board four months ago as the National Sales Director.

CourseScout shoots complete footage of golf courses and gives that footage to the course in exchange for monetizing the content with a small non-invasive ad in the top left-hand corner.

The software platform, which is one-of-a-kind and created by Kato, is unlike anything in the market today. It recognizes use on a mobile device or a computer and adapts the footage to that device. Advertisers and course personnel get a snapshot of who is watching the footage location, where they are watching from, and if they are a new or existing user of the CourseScout platform. Links from the footage go straight to a golf course's online booking engine allowing CourseScout to increase rounds without being involved in the electronic tee sheet,taking rounds or taking any percentage of round revenue.

"This technology is unlike anything I've ever seen in the golf business," said Price, who has been with Tee to Green Golf Magazine since 2002. "For the Head Professional or Director of Golf that wears a bunch of hats, this is a no-brainer. It is a win for all involved, especially if your marketing budget is tight. I'm glad Matt

and Nicole decided to basically start their what will be a massive footprint in the United States here in

Louisiana and Mississippi. We are anxiously looking forward to adding

another 10-12 courses in our local area this spring and then taking on the rest of the country."

The wild and weird year of 2020 was used to start CourseScout's footprint on the country and that goal was started on the Gulf South.

"We've created a platform that delivers engaging and enjoyable content to golfers, actively and positively promotes courses and gives industry sponsors a laser focused platform to build brand awareness," Jones said. "We can't wait to show you all we have planned for the upcoming year. Stay tuned. It's going to be great!"


One of the recent new features on the platform is a layered map behind the course you are watching so once you are finished watching the course of your choice, you can see other courses in the CourseScout family in a map format compared to just a basic listing.

Two of the earliest courses on the CourseScout site (coursescout.io) were The Golf Club at Stonebridge (Bossier City, La.) and Crooked Hollow Golf Club in Greenwood, La. The other three in Louisiana are Cane Row Golf and Turf Club (New Iberia, La.), LaTour Golf Club (Mathews, La.) and The Pines at North Park in Denham Springs.






