ALBATROSS CLUB



On July 19 during the second round of the Louisiana Golf Association's Four-Ball Championship, *Mike Stackus* (Baton Rouge, La.) completed the par-5 seventh hole at Ellendale Country Club (Houma, La.) in only two strokes when his second shot from 252 found the bottom of the cup. The hole was playing 542 yards that day.

University of Southern Mississippi sophomore golfer *Hunter Atkins* aced No. 12 (a par-4) with his driver at Hattiesburg (Miss.) Country Club on Sept. 12. The rare albatross ace was from 290 yards. Atkins is from West Point, Miss.

Landon Andre' also recorded an albatross ace when his driver allowed him to complete the 342-yard par-4 second hole at LaTour Golf Club (Mathews, La.) on Aug. 2 in one shot. That tee shot was witnessed by Trevor Curry, Dakota Richard, Justin Mavanto and Chris Patin. Andre' has been playing golf for six years and resides in Brusly, La. This was his first albatross and hole-in-one.

Joe Cabaniss aced No. 17 (a par-4) at The Bridges Golf Club at Hollywood Casino (Bay St. Louis, Miss.) on Aug. 16. The 274-yard shot was with a driver and was the first ace and double eagle for Cabaniss.

Bayou Oaks at City Park on a roll

Spend enough time in New Orleans and you will hear the phrase Laissez Les Bons Temps Rouler, which translated to English simply states 'Let the Good Times Roll.'

While New Orleans and the rest of South Louisiana have seen better times, Bayou Oaks at City Park seems to be one of those silver-lining stories in sea of COVID-19 pandemic times.

Opened just three years ago, the South Course has gotten rave reviews and is a favorite of tourists as well as Louisiana and Mississippi residents alike. Teamed with TPC Louisiana just a few



miles south, it has given the Crescent City a great one-two punch that many other major cities have been having for a long time. Bayou Oaks at City Park also has a North Course, which first opened in 1969 and was closed for almost three years because of Hurricane Katrina. Now re-opened for 12 years, the North Course is a favorite of locals as from the tips it only plays at 5,740 yards (by comparison, the South Course can play at 7,302 yards). The North Course



features water on eight holes and offers a challenge, but fun test and places a demand on shot and club selection.

It is no secret that New Orleans and its businesses get a lot of revenue from tourism, but with those revenues severely strangled and at times cut off, many of the estimated two million people in Southeast have stayed close to home since March and have been looking for things to do outside.

Enter golf, which aside from its large pre- and post-tournament gatherings, lends itself to social-distancing.

Bayou Oaks at City Park has not gotten the restaurant/dining/clubhouse rental business it is accustomed to, but it has set records with rounds played. In

March, there was a 21% increase in rounds played (6,100). April saw 8,100 rounds played (an increase of 29% compared to 2019). May was a record month with 9,100 rounds played (20% increase from last year). Because of Tropical Storm

Cristobal, numbers were down a few percentage points for June, but July was 24% better than a year ago with 6,500 rounds played (that was done with over 16 inches of rain logged on the course). August was another improvement month (up 26 percent compared to 2019) as 6,900 rounds were played.

"We've seen an increase in people returning to the game and new golfers, which is great for the game long term," said Bayou Oaks at City Park General Manager Brian Long. "Hopefully the industry can keep the momentum going and continue to show that golf is a great and safe way to get some outdoor activity."

The over 43,500 rounds logged at Bayou Oaks at City Park from March-August are helping fund Columbia Parc, a housing development in the Seventh Ward of New Orleans.

Inspired by the revitalization of the East Lake Golf Club community in Atlanta, three prominent businessmen in New Orleans formed the Bayou District Foundation, a nonprofit organization to spearhead neighborhood redevelopment in New Orleans. Construction of Columbia Parc became a reality when the Housing Authority of New Orleans received \$120 million in low-income housing tax credits from a variety of federal programs and selected the Bayou District Foundation as its partner. All told, 685 mixed-income residential units, including a senior living center, were built over 13 city blocks. The Bayou District Foundation manages both of the golf courses at historic City Park.

The South Course was designed by renowned architect Rees Jones, who designed two other public courses that are atop almost every best-of list — Torrey Pines in southern California and Bethpage Black near New York City.

New Orleans' City Park boasted four courses pre-Katrina and the new South Course was built over the former East and West courses. The North Course re-opened in 2008 and the South Course will be the final course at the new-and-improved City Park, which is just north of the French Quarter and has I-610 running right through it.


New Orleans has been through a lot in its 302 years of existence. Golf has been part of City Park since 1902. While a pandemic is not an ideal time to see a rising interest in the game of golf, it is nice to see and welcomed as lots of golf facilities are in a transition period looking to get new families and younger players involved. As part of this re-birth in the game of golf, New Orleans will continue to let the good times roll no matter what the circumstances it is dealt. This city has been through a lot and always seems to find a silver lining in any situation.

Bayou Oaks at City Park, which also features a two-story driving range, can be accessed from I-610 from the west by taking Exit IA north or from the east taking Exit 2C north.

Both courses have special rates for Louisiana residents and use dynamic pricing, meaning the best rate can be found online at www.cityparkgolf.com.

Emerson completes three state golf trails

Cory Emerson completed an impressive feat when he played an Oct. 17 round at The Preserve Golf Club in Vancleave, Miss.

The round marked the completion of playing all the courses on the seldom-known Magnolia Golf Trail as well as two other state golf tours.

Emerson's goal of playing the Natural State Golf Trail (Arkansas), Audubon Golf Trail (Louisiana) and the Magnolia Golf Trail started back in 2017. Emerson, who resides in Monroe, La., was born and raised in south Arkansas. He first attended Louisiana Tech in 2000 and has been a Louisiana resident ever since. He is an assistant principal at Caldwell Parish High School.

"It's been really fun to play all of these great courses," said Emerson, 38. "I love being outside and love the game of golf."

The Magnolia Golf Trail is the smallest one of the three he's played. By comparison, the Natural State Golf Trail has 12 facilities and when he played the AGT it had 15 courses (it now has 17).

Emerson started playing golf as a

freshman in high school and only because his best friend was a good golfer and the high school he attended needed one more player to help start a golf team at his school. It took some persuasion from Emerson's friend, but he eventually joined the team and hadn't stopped swinging the sticks since. Looking back, Emerson thinks

he probably would have not started playing golf at all if it had not been for that moment 24 years ago.

His run of playing 38 different courses actually started on July 26, 2013 when he played Glenwood (Arkansas) Country Club. It was long before Emerson thought of playing three of the closest state golf trails to him.

"I played that course long before I had ever heard of any golf trails. The only reason I happened to keep the scorecard is because I beat my friend that day and I wanted to keep it for bragging rights," Emerson admitted.

The course closest to him is Black Bear Golf Club in Delhi, La. and would be the one he would play if he could only play one course the rest of his life.

"I really enjoy that place," he said. "The course really fits my eye and I appreciate it being so spaced out. It's a fair and challenging course."

His other state favorites in Louisiana are TPC Louisiana (Avondale) and The Golf Club at Audubon Park (New Orleans), which is the state's oldest course. Emerson's only ace was at Audubon Park when

he holed out No. II on March 25, 2018. The I3I-yard shot was with a 9-iron and witnessed by Griffin McGee and Breanna Harper. That round was the final one for Emerson completing the Audubon Golf Trail.

"I know they have added some courses since I completed it (Oak Knoll Country Club in Hammond, LaTour Golf Club in Mathews and Bayou Oaks at City Park South Course in New Orleans) and I plan on playing all of those soon," Emerson said.

Favorites in Arkansas include Mountain Ranch Golf Club (Fairfield Bay), Big Creek Golf and Country Club (Mountain Home) and Tannenbaum Golf Club (Drasco). His favorite two on the Magnolia Golf Trail were Shell Landing Golf Club (Gautier) and The Preserve Golf Club (Vancleave). Those two were the final ones he played in Mississippi. Emerson was born in El Dorado, Arkansas and raised in Emerson, which is about 45 miles southwest of El Dorado and eight miles north of the Louisiana border.

His lone eagle while playing the trails came at Sage Meadows Country Club in Jonesboro, Ark.

Future plans for Emerson include going play all five courses associated with Big Cedar Lodge in Branson, Missouri and also play some of the course on the Robert Trent Jones Golf Tour in Alabama.

Editor's note: Eagle Crest Golf Course (Alma) is listed on the Natural State's Golf Trail website, but has been closed since 2019. The facility is hoping to open up again soon.
