Please carry this permit with you at all times when protesting.

If any officials disregard your permit, sue them for violating your rights under the Canadian Bill of Rights.





Canadian Bill of Rights

1960, c. 44

An Act for the Recognition and Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms

Assented to 10th August 1960

the dignity and worth of the human person and the position of the WHE Parliament of Canada, affirming that the Canadian Dation is founded upon principles that acknowledge the supremacy of God,

freedom is founded upon respect for moral and spiritual values and the Affirming also that men and institutions remain free only when lamlly in a society of free men and free institutions; rule of law;

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:
