#### **Course Description:**

This course will provide students the opportunity to understand the islands that make up Oceania. In addition to culture and physical features, this course will provide students with **knowledge and an understanding of the characteristics of governments in the Pacific region**; for example: monarchies, free association trust territories, and independent entities. The course will also provide an understanding of how the governments of Oceania are organized (branches, agencies, departments), their purposes, and structures of government (local, state, national). Students will study the social, political and economic development of each chain of islands.
