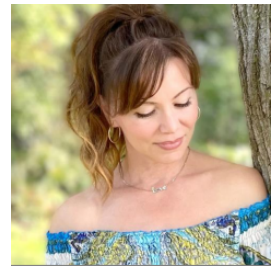

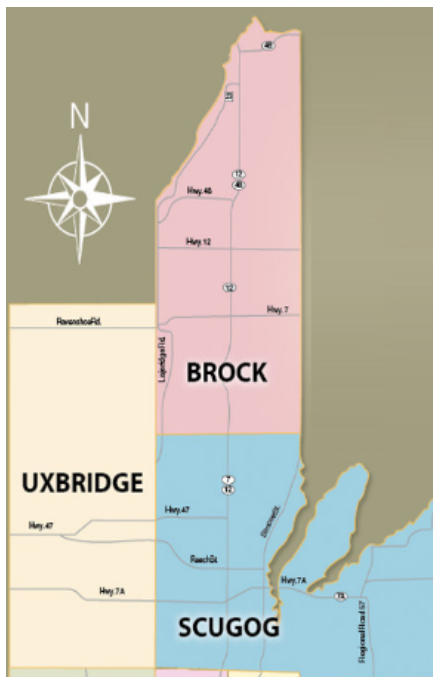
## Lake Simcoe Area Probus Club

## Upcycling Day is June 24 (Report by Janet Patterson)

Did you even know? And just what is upcycling anyway? Is it any different from recycling?

We all recycle if we can. However, the creative among us may also upcycle.

Upcycling is recycling (something) in such a way that the resulting product is of higher value than the original item. Whereas recycling is the breakdown of used materials into new materials that can be used for other products, upcycling is transformational.

Some examples of upcycling: turning an old vase into a lamp base; making something out of old clothing or fabrics; painting/upholstering worn-out furniture etc. The number of ways, and the number of things, that can be upcycled are limited only by one's imagination.



In many ways upcycling is its own reward. The environment benefits from the reduction of waste sent to landfill; less need for production of new goods or the extraction of raw materials - thus, less air and water pollution, less greenhouse gas emissions as well as the conservation of natural resources.

There are personal benefits too. If you want to help out Mother Nature, this is a good way. It gets your creative juices flowing and if your muse has abandoned you, find someone to whom you can donate your 'stuff' e.g., animal shelters, artisans. You will feel just as good – guaranteed.

So, next time you are about to discard something, STOP - take a moment and ask yourself, could this item be made into something else? You will be doing yourself, and the world, a favour. It's something our ancestors knew how to do and the world needs us to relearn.
