MENTAL HEALTH

If you have a history of mental health treatment in or out of jail it is important to set up services before release.

Setting up Community Treatment:

- 1. Apply for medical assistance with your jail Case Manager prior to discharge.
- 2. Ask your Case Manager for community options for treatment.
- 3. Your current medication list will be on a reentry plan that will be given to you by your Case Manager before discharge.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL TREATMENT

If you have a history of substance abuse you may need treatment or at least an assessment for services. If an assessment is court ordered it can be conducted while you are in jail. If you are already out contact **Lehigh County Drug & Alcohol** at 610-782-3555. To receive treatment there are limited county funds to pay for services so you will need to apply for medical assistance. If you are in jail consider attending NA, AA, Relapse Prevention or the men's DARE Program.

To apply for a non-driver ID card, you will need to visit your local PennDOT office with:

- 1. Completed form DL 54A
- 2. Birth Certificate (no copies) or valid passport
- 3. Social Security Card
- 4. Proof of address (lease, W2, utility bill)
- 5. Check or money order to "PennDOT" for the amount of \$29.50

The local office is at 1710 Hoover Ave (off Airport Rd) Allentown, PA 18109.
