**Fit to Lead** classes will be interactive and include skits, role playing, social surfing, and much more while we discover what it means to embrace our kingdom authority. At the completion of BYF, delegates will receive a certificate of completion.

**Kingdom Kid Learn and Sing**- Through songs, games and other activities, children will learn the books of the Bible, key scriptures of faith and tools for a successful Christian life.

**God's Rule** Rule- Everywhere we go there are rules: home, school and church. This class will assist the student in learning God's main rules (the 10 Commandments) and how they should govern their lives. Your child will learn each commandment and what each means for his/her life. Our goal is to help each child form a strong moral/ethical framework for the future.

**A DOPE Me! -** This course deals with practical, simple ways of applying tools to succeed as a Christian by exploring what it means to be a follower of God.

**FLY and Saved**-This course will present an overview of the Bible with emphasis on who God says we are and will help students to appreciate the importance of God's Word and its relevance to our day to day living.

God's Drumline- In a marching band, it is the drum line that sets the rhythm for the entire band. As Christians, we are called to be Christ's representatives on earth setting examples for what it means to live godly lives. In the life of a Christian, it is Jesus who is to be our Drum Major setting the pace and guidelines for our life. In this session, our children will learn how to live their lives, as God would have them and what it means to be in solidarity with Christ.

**YOU better tell somebody**- Students will explore ways to incorporate evangelism as a way of life instead of an infrequent project. Students will also learn key discipleship skills that they can practice in their own lives and use to encourage young Christians that they are mentoring.

**Real and Relevant**- This course is designed for the youth worker with special emphasis on practical ways for discovering needs and interest for the youth and organizational structure.
