

TORNADO PREPARATION

Checklist

- Identify a safe room or storm shelter (interior room on the lowest floor, away from windows)
- Practice tornado drills with your family
- Sign up for local emergency alerts and weather apps
- Prepare an emergency kit (include water, food, flashlight, batteries, first aid, whistle, meds, and cash)
- Keep important documents in a waterproof, portable container
- Know your local tornado risk and warning systems (watch vs. warning)
- Trim trees and secure outdoor items that could become projectiles
- Anchor or reinforce mobile homes and sheds
- Make a communication plan in case family members are separated
- Store sturdy shoes, blankets, and helmets in or near your safe room

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
