Rules and regulations

<p>1.</p> <p>Senior & Junior anglers</p>	<p>1.0: Adult Anglers are aged 16 years and over</p> <p>1.1: Junior Anglers are aged 11-15 years</p> <p>1.2: Small Fry Anglers are aged 10 years and under</p> <p>1.3: Anglers under the age of 16 may register as adults but may not claim junior prizes.</p> <p>1.4: Anglers must nominate their category upon registration e.g. Adult or junior. Age must be specified to allocate junior or small fry.</p>
<p>2.</p> <p>Prize categories</p>	<p>MUST BE AT PRESENTATION TO CLAIM PRIZE. (IF YOU CANT MAKE IT PLEASE NOTIFY SARA (0408 914 873) OR DAVE (0407 867 221) BY 3PM SUNDAY</p> <p>2.0: <u>Champion Boat</u> (the most amount of cm of each largest fish per species caught by all anglers, this is a fun group prize!)</p> <p>2.1: <u>May Day Champion</u> (the angler with the highest number of cm by adding up largest fish per species) Perpetual Trophy and Prize</p> <p>2.2: <u>Champion Adult</u> (the angler with the highest number of cm by adding up largest fish per species, that is not the May Day Champion)</p> <p>2.3: <u>Champion Junior</u> (the angler between age 11 and 15 years with the highest number of cm by adding up largest fish per species that is not the May Day Champion)</p> <p>2.4: <u>Champion Small-Fry</u> (the angler 10 years and under) with the highest number of cm by adding up largest fish per species after the May Day Champion.</p> <p>2.5: Longest fish of each species.</p> <p>2.6: Lucky Draw Prizes (you must be at the club to claim!)</p>

<p>3.</p> <p>Eligible species</p>	<p>3.0: Pelagic Species</p> <p>3.1: Cobia</p> <p>3.2: Spanish mackerel (including broad-barred mackerel)</p> <p>3.3: Tuna (all species)</p> <p>3.4: Trevally (all species)</p> <p>3.5: Queenfish</p> <p>3.6: Barracuda</p>
	<p>3.0: Reef species</p> <p>3.7: Bar Cheeked coral trout</p> <p>3.8: Emperors (including Blue lined, Blue spot, Spangled and Red emperors)</p> <p>3.9: Cod (all species)</p> <p>3.10: Sea Perches (including Spanish flag, Fingermark, Saddletail and Crimson sea perch)</p> <p>3.11: Bluebone</p> <p>3.12: Javelin Fish</p>
<p>Eligible species cont.</p>	<p>3.0: Estuary species</p> <p>3.13: Mangrove Jack</p> <p>3.14: Giant Threadfin Salmon</p> <p>3.15: Blue nosed salmon</p> <p>3.16: Triple tail</p> <p>3.17: Black Jewfish</p> <p>3.18: Barramundi</p>
<p>4.</p> <p>Fishing Times & Area</p>	<p>4.0: Fishing begins: 6am Saturday 9 May</p> <p>4.1: Scorecards MUST BE HANDED IN BY 3.00pm Sunday 10 May</p> <p>16: Fishing area – as per attached map</p>
<p>5.</p> <p>Points</p>	<p>5.0: Scores will be a total length in cm of your biggest fish per species</p> <p>5.1: Fish must be the minimum length noted on the score card to be able to be scored (Small-fry anglers have NO minimum size).</p>

<p>6.</p> <p>Honour system</p>	<p>6.0: This is a catch and record competition.</p> <p>6.1: Proof of capture is required for each eligible scoring fish. Fish MUST be photographed on a brag mat showing the entire length of the fish AND the 2026 May Day score card.</p> <p>6.2: To have a fish score towards an angler's total, that fish MUST have been angled by that angler from time of hook up to landing the fish. (Note: small fry anglers may have assistance from an adult to achieve the capture)</p>
<p>7.</p> <p>Scoring and score cards</p>	<p>7.0: Scores will only be accepted if submitted on the score card provided to anglers after registration and fee payment.</p> <p>7.1: Score cards will not be accepted after 3:00pm Sunday 10 May. Any team that encounters problems that hinder their ability to hand the score card in MUST notify Sara (0408 914 873) or Dave (0407 867 221)</p> <p>7.2: Each angler may only submit one score card</p> <p>7.3: Only one angler may enter their species on any one score card.</p>
<p>8.</p> <p>Presentation</p>	<p>8.0: Prizes will be awarded on the Presentation Night (after all scores have been collated) on Sunday 10 May at 5.30pm.</p>
<p>9.</p> <p>Judges Decision is Final</p>	<p>9.0: Whilst protests or concerns by anglers may be lodged (before 5.30pm Sunday 10 May), the decisions of the May Day Classic subcommittee are final, and no correspondence will be entered into.</p>
