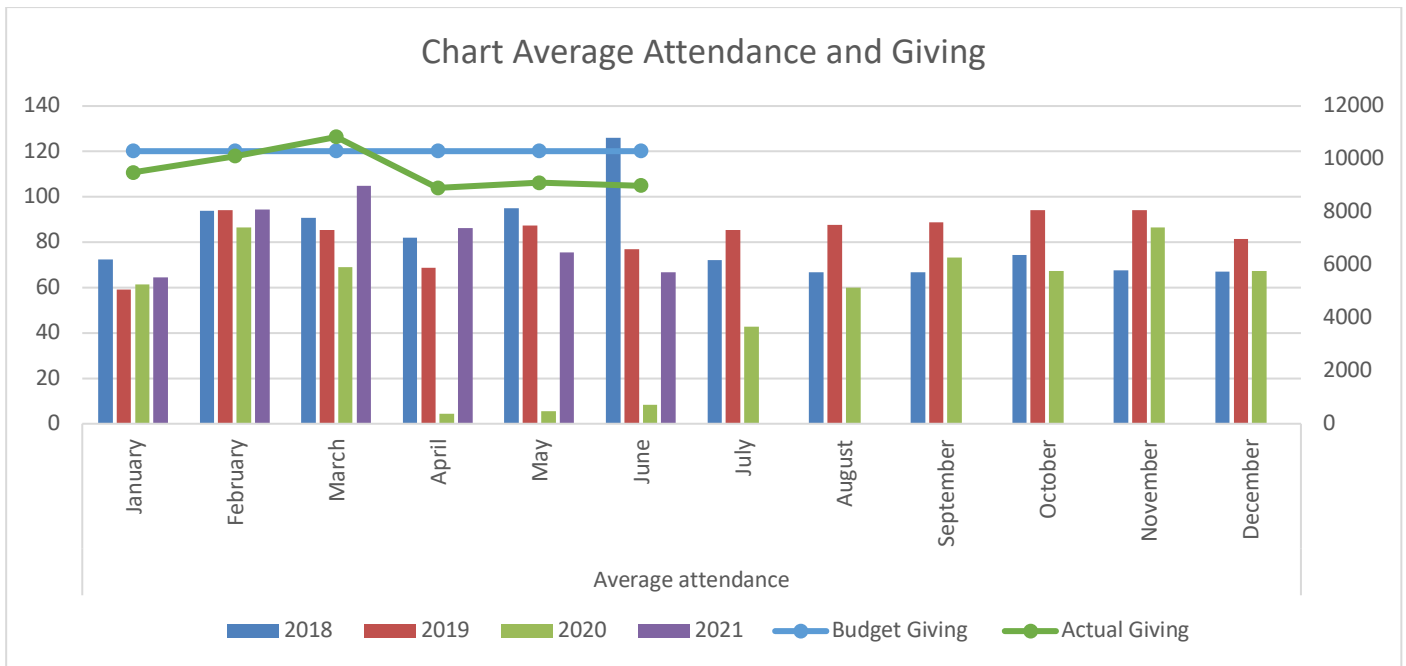
REPORTS

Minister's report June/July 2021

- June/July was a steady month in our parish with the Wanka House move finishing and a number of parishioners passing onto glory
- Max Borchadt Baptised in Tara on June 13, Renae, Ezra, Piper and Henry Smith baptised in Dalby on June 3
- Wedding Hemi Gyde and Yvonne Pace on June 12, where David preached and Rev. Chris presided
- Funerals for Ron Lambley(Ian Harris officiating), Mark Brown (Ken Hansen assisting), Janice Topp
- The Alpha Retreat June 19 in Bell went well with 12 participants and a lot of growth, the Alpha group will meet once more in July to discuss where they would like to go as a group in the future
- In our Sunday services we finished off our Follow the Saviour series in Mark's Gospel with some great kids talks and a visit from guest preacher Ron Spindler

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- Ignite Youth met on June 6, and on June 20 for a breakup dinner and movie night
- Connect Cards have been received well with a number of people sharing prayer points and asking for follow up visits
- From June 21-June 25, Zoë and I attended the Western Region Clergy Muster lead by Bishop Cam at Toowoomba Anglican School. It was a good opportunity to meet with other clergy in the region, hear from Archbishop Phillip about his Vision for the Anglican Church of Southern Queensland, and to spend time in prayer and learning
- The following week Zoë, Micah, Jude and myself attended Diocesan Youth Camp – Senior Ichthus. Unfortunately the camp was called off on Tuesday June 28 (Day 3) but it is hoped that the remaining days might happen later in the year as another camp. The theme of the camp was integrity and 33 campers from across Southern Queensland attended with a group of roughly 15 leaders. Zoë and David prepared bible studies on different characters in the Bible and talks on the Sermon on the Mount. The time we did get to spend at camp was a good opportunity to learn new games, meet new people, and grow as leaders. We hope that more youth from Dalby can attend future Ichthus camps and AYCF expressed it's deep gratitude to Dalby Parish for supporting this camp
- From Saturday July 3 to Wednesday July 7 I took annual leave with my family. We decided not to visit Brisbane as we'd planned, due to COVID-19 lockdowns, and instead spent time in Dalby resting and praying for the remainder of 2021
- Sunday Attendance was lower than in previous years 71 1st Sunday, 78 2nd Sunday , 60 3rd Sunday, 58 4th Sunday

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COVID 19 Warden's Report

Just as we were starting to enjoy some relaxed rules around attending church – things change once again.

The Qld Ap is proving very successful in the community and I would assume with church registrations also. We must be mindful of the proximity of the impacted areas in SE Qld and encourage anyone visiting from the impacted areas to wear a face mask. Also continue to encourage anyone unwell to stay at home. (this includes volunteers! – there is always someone around that can step in if a rostered member is unwell)

We had a discussion about hospitality and morning tea at the last warden's meeting – with the view to continue outdoor gathering with the coffee van and the possibility of providing wrapped biscuits.

Cleaning frequently touched surfaces continues to be important – particularly following funerals and other weekday services.

This is the current information from the Anglican website: (the rules regarding Impacted area churches are in place until July 16)

- Churches in non-impacted areas are required to follow the [COVID Safe Checklist: Restricted Businesses](#).
- Indoor spaces — one person per 2 square metres or 100% capacity with ticketed and allocated seating.
- Funerals and weddings — one person per 2 square metres or 200 people (whichever is greater) or 100% capacity with ticketed and allocated seating.
- Face mask wearing requirements apply to anyone who has been in an impacted area at any time from 1 am 29 June 2021.
- Gatherings in private residences — up to 100 people.
- Indoor events are required to follow the [COVID Safe Event Checklist](#).
