Main Points:

- Framework, not a diagnosis
- Causes:
 - Unique Brain Injury for Operators: interface astroglial scarring from repeated exposure to blast injuries throughout training/deployment/career (not detectable on MRI)
 - High Allostatic Load= operations tempo over 20 years, Loss of team members/friends, Stress on family

Common Symptoms: - Endocrine disturbances ie. Low Testosterone O Problems with sexual health and - Lab Referral for Blood Panel:

- Sleep DisturbanceSleep Disturbances & Obstructive Sleep
- Sleep Disturbances & Obstructive Sleep Apnea
 - Trouble falling asleep
 Trouble staying asleep
 Snoring/breathing issues
 - Feeling exhausted in the morning
- Pain
 - Chronic joint/back pain
 Other orthopedic problems
- Emotional & Mental Health Challenges
 - Depression & sadness
 - Anger
 - o Worry and rumination
 - o Feelings of guilt
 - Stress reactivity
 - o Marital / Family issues
 - Hypervigilance "being on guard" & anxiety
- Cognitive Challenges
 - Short- and Long-Term Memory changes
 - o Headaches
 - Concentration, Focus issues
 - o Other cognitive impairments
- Vestibular impairment
 - Dizziness
- Vision impairments
 - Overshooting eyes when tracking
 - Blurry vision
