FEATURE ARTICLE: WINTER STORAGE

Hang on, cause there's lots to cover and talk about when it comes to winterizing our Corvettes. Some who have been decade long Corvette owners probably have their winter storage methods down pat and need nothing new to complete their winter storage routines. But for those who are either new at this process or are looking at improving the end results, you may find something here that helps you! Storing our Corvettes can be a daunting task if not properly prepared for beforehand. Pre-planning is the first item on the list of priorities! Knowing what you're going to do before the cold weather arrives is an absolute must. And that time is NOW!

Ouestions such as, Is the car going to be stored indoors or out? What is the storage environment going to be like. Will it be stored in a climate-controlled environment? Will it be kept outside in the driveway? Or somewhere in the middle in a cold garage! So much can go into this one decision alone... Do you take your car to a storage facility like our PP member company, Volk Motor Storage and pay someone to do all the legwork for you and simply write a check? Do you prep your car and put it away in your own garage, and do you know the dos and don'ts associated with garage storage? Or are you like so many that will end up keeping it stored outside, to endure the elements of the cold wet winter?

Whichever category you fall into, short of driving your car to Volk and dropping it off, (even then some items will still need your attention) the basics of winter storage will involve some sort of action to have the car be ready to go come next spring. The list of questions is somewhat long, and each should be addressed beforehand to give you both peace of mind, to protect your car, and to have it ready to go come spring.

Here are just a few:

Do I have Maintenance performed before storage such as an oil change or other fluid exchanges

Do I have the car detailed before storage?

Do I have a plan to keep the battery charged during the winter months?

Do I have a way of protecting the cars finish from winters elements such as an indoor or outdoor high-quality cover? (And btw, Indoor and outdoor covers are designed to work completely differently)

Do I have a way of keeping the tires from flat spotting? And actually, what is tire flat spotting.

Do I have a way to keep rodents out of and away from the car?

How much fuel should I leave in the tank when stored?

There are more... but these are some of the basic questions that will need your attention.

Maintenance: Depending upon how often and how many miles you drive each year can be the best guidance when it comes to when to do fluid services. Are you a owner of a garage queen that sees only a few thousand miles each year? Then for you, chances are your fluids get changed only once a year. So, waiting till spring will shorten the amount of time before you'll need to perform another oil change. Remember these cars track both mileage and time when it comes to oil change maintenance. The time the car sits unused still keeps that maintenance clock turning. For those people who put more than 5,000 miles a year, it's always a good idea to change out the oil and other fluids before putting the car away for storage. You're probably going to have to do more than one oil change each driving season, so storing the car with fresh oil makes more sense.

Detailing... Yes! This one is a must! Regardless of where and how you are planning on storing your Corvette! Detailing at least the exterior is an absolute no brainer and should always be done before storing the car for winter! Storing inside in a garage being covered, having the car detailed will add a layer of protection against the cover rubbing directly on the paint. Outdoor storage detailing it is also a must, as the cover will most certainly be buffered by the wind and without the added layer of protection can increase the chances the cover could damage and adversely affect the exterior finish. Our PP members at Lethal Premium Car Care can take care of the detailing portion of your storage concerns easily and quickly!

Battery: Again, depending upon your choice of storage, keeping the battery charge fresh is among one of the most important things you'll need to have a plan for and can eliminate the dead battery headaches come spring. (these cars do not act well with low voltage batteries!) If you are in an environment that allows use of a trickle charger, then going this route will ensure the battery is maintained and ready to go. Do not cheap out on a tender! Invest in a high-quality proven model that is specific to Corvettes or high-end cars. Expect to spend around a hundred bucks for a good UL approved battery tender!

This is one area that paying to have your car professionally stored, will most often be taken care of as most all storage facilities will include some sort of battery tender as part of the service. Sometimes at an additional fee. (Our PP members at **Vault Motor Storage** include battery tender service at no charge for our members)

If you are storing the car in a location that does not grant electrical access, then, you should plan on, first, removing all electrical devices in the car, such as phone chargers, radio inputs or other devices that can draw on the car's battery. Then depending upon your location and schedule, plan on starting the car at least once every two to three weeks, and letting it run up to temperature for a half hour or more. Finally, for those who are unable to even do this, then removing the battery totally and storing it somewhere on a tender makes the most sense. (btw never store the battery directly on a concrete surface without some sort of insulated fire-resistant pad under the battery)

Tires: Tires will flat spot! It's going to happen! Anytime a low-profile tire like what's on our Corvettes, sets for even a short period of time, the tires will develop a flat bottom against the contact surface. Sitting for six months in the same position will most certainly bring on flat spots!

Michelin which many consider to be the leader in tire technology states: if your tires have been subjected to long storage times while loaded and over-inflated and with fairly high or low temperatures, the tires could develop a "semipermanent" flat spotting. This flat spotting will eventually go away, but it may take a bit of driving.

Do not overinflate the tires, keep them at the manufacturers recommended pressures! If you are storing the car for an extended period of time, it is best that the car be moved occasionally, by even just a few inches to change the position of the tires which come in contact with the surface below. If possible, put some sort of barrier between the tires and the concrete surface, such as foam insulation pads to soften the firmness between the tire and the surface below. If you are removing your tires and storing them separately, (Not recommended) lay the tires down on a flat padded surface. If the car is being kept on jack stands, the suspension should be kept in a neutral position, (the same height as if the tires were on the car) and not left unloaded or compressed. Additionally, there are now products available that you can place under your car that contour the natural tire shape that you can buy and drive onto. (be careful in doing this as it's not as easy as it sounds driving the car up onto them!)

For those storing outside or in a cold garage, moving the car just an inch or so, while you are starting it to keep the battery charged will help keep the flat spotting to a minimum and shorten the distance needed come spring to get rid of the flat spotting! All tire flat spotting eventually does go away...

Rodent Control: This one is biggies! Rodents don't get into your car just to be a nuisance. They are doing what mother nature has intended them to do, which is to find the best home for their survival and to breed their young. Your car just happens to afford a prime home for this to happen. Yes, they are a nuisance and can be downright damaging to your stored vehicles.

But... there things that you can do to both minimize and eliminate this issue. You can set traps around the vehicle and catch and kill those that wander into the traps... But you are only going to get a very small percentage of all the critters that are interested in making your car their home! It's better and more effective to make your car as unattractive as possible for them to not want to go anywhere near it as the best remedy for this issue. This is one were depending upon what type of critter you're dealing with, there are product remedies available to

deter them all away. For the most often one, mice... There are several products that you can place around and in your car that will absolutely keep all the mice away, which is a much better deterrent to the few you can catch in traps. A product called Fresh Cab is one that many have successfully used for years to deter mice. (Available at Tractor Supply) These scent packs last about 30-60 days and actually do not have a terrible smell to us, only the mice! Placing them under the hood, in the cab and lying around the garage floor works wonders! Peppermint spray is also another effective deterrent available in one form or another.

One thing that we absolutely do not recommend is the use of any type of poisons, as while they may kill the mice, any other creature that ether eats that mouse as it dies, or wanders into the poison, will itself become very ill, Hawks, Owls and other birds of prey along with potentially family pets such as cats or dogs will be seriously poisoned or killed! Just don't do this!

Lastly, also remember to either cover you exhaust tips or place balled up aluminum foil in the ends to close off the openings. (just remember to remove them before starting the car)

Fuel: This one is open to debate among many as to which is the best method to store your Corvette during the winter hibernation months. Some say to fill the tank to the brim and add a fuel storage stabilizer and you are all set come spring time. Others say to do a 1/4 tank with stabilizer. Yet others say 1/2 full with stabilizer. However, there are a few things that most everyone agrees on!

- 1. Always add some sort of fuel stabilizer regardless of how much gas you decide to keep in the tank...
- 2. Add premium high-octane fuel when you store the car for an extended period of time, (most everyone already runs premium high-octane fuel year-round)
- 3. Today's fuel tanks and systems are a sealed and closed system and are not prone to any condensation build up in the fuel tanks. (Most modern cars have use closed system)

Here's the one that the majority of the experts think makes the most sense... Fill your tank between 1/4 and 1/2 full with a good stabilizer. Then in the spring fill your tank with fresh high-octane fuel and it will mix with the stored fuel giving you a healthier mix of fuel going through your system come springtime.

Hope these tips help... one final thought, if you still are unsure on what steps to take... ask someone who has been storing their car successfully over the years for some of their best tips!
