Laps for Charity Events

2024 was another great season for the **Laps for Charity Events** at NHMS! 81 **SONHC** and **SOME C** members attended one or more of these three great fundraising events in 2024! **SONHC** places a great deal of importance on our relationship with this great organization! And, this month we hear from **Danielle Cyr**, the program director at NHMS. Danielle was kind enough to share answers to ten questions about the LFC program, the role she plays, and a couple of interesting tidbits about these events.



Laps For Charity began connected to NASCAR weekend giving fans the opportunity to drive their own street legal vehicle around the famed NHMS one-mile oval also known as "the Magic Mile." When I took over the charity, I started to grow our laps events to other dates outside of NASCAR and to also include our 1.6-mile road course configuration. I learned how much car enthusiasts really enjoy going right and left and up and down, it's a whole different thrill! It's fun for all ages, we also offer pace car rides to those who prefer not to drive. I aim to host 3 to 4 events per calendar year starting in May and running each month through August. These events depend on open track dates. We hope to announce our 2025 Laps for Charity dates in January 2025.

1. *Can you give us a quick overview of the history of the Speedway Children's Charities, and the Laps for Charity events? How many are held each year and which other tracks besides NHMS are they held at?*

Speedway Children's Charities was started in 1982 by O. Bruton Smith, Chairman of Speedway Motorsports Incorporated and Sonic Automotive Incorporated, as a memorial and legacy to his son, Bruton Cameron Smith. After losing his young child, Smith became passionate about wanting to help children in need. **The New Hampshire chapter began in 2009 and has distributed more than \$2.25 million supporting more than 1.4 million children across New England.**

2. *How did you first become involved with the NHMS and the Laps for Charity events?*

I started at New Hampshire Motor Speedway as the Marketing Manager in 2017. As time progressed and in 2020 when COVID changed the company model a bit, I was asked to also take on the charity at the Speedway. It's been a fun four years of learning and growing our chapter to what it is today. I am looking forward to raising even more and helping more children in the future.

3. *What's a typical workday look like at the track for you?*

That's the great part about working for Speedway Motorsports — every day is different. Besides the charity, I am also the Director of Marketing for New Hampshire Motor Speedway and for the NASCAR race at Circuit of the Americas in Austin, Texas. Marketing these races throughout the year and assisting at other Speedway Motorsports tracks across the country (there are 11) makes each week new and exciting! My main focuses are marketing to promote NASCAR ticket sales and helping raise as much money as we can to help children in New England. How I get there...there isn't enough space!

4. *Do you have a particular part of your job you enjoy the most?*

I enjoy traveling to assist at race tracks across the country. It helps me grow, learn, and to bring all the company's best practices and fun events to my home track here in New Hampshire!

5. *Can you share some of the successful stories the LFC events have brought to the children and the families they positively effect?*

All funds raised during our yearly Laps for Charity and other SCC events throughout the year are given out in December at our grant ceremony at the Palace Theatre in Manchester, NH. Myself and the Speedway Board of Trustees take a lot of time to carefully go through and vet each application, and visit each location to confirm all monies go directly to help children in need. We take a lot of pride in our hard work. It is a great feeling handing out those checks that will impact so many lives.

6. *Anything you'd like to share about next year's LFC events? Will they be returning for 2025?*

YES, of course, Laps for Charity will return! We are planning to hold road course Laps for Charity 2-3 times in 2025. The dates will be announced in January.

7. *Whenever we attend a LFC events, we always see so many happy people working at the track that help make the whole experience so enjoyable. Can you tell us about these people who all help to make the event so successful?*

That is so kind to say, thank you! We have a mix of NHMS staff, friends, and SCC Board members who

come out and volunteer their time at our lap's events. As one of our staff who assisted this year from our ticketing department has said, "I love coming to help with Laps for Charity. We raise money and everyone who comes is having fun and is so happy!" Without their help I would never be able to accomplish all we do, from registration to the infield experience and photos in Victory Lane.

8. *So, what's the deal with the Toyota pace cars we all follow around during the events? How many are at the track? Are they modified at all and who decides who gets to drive them?*

New Hampshire Motor Speedway is a Toyota-sponsored race track. We currently have two 2025 Camry XSE pace cars on property. They are the top-of-the-line Camrys to give our participants the most exhilarating experience. The drivers go through training and Joey and Scott, who have been doing laps for the past few years, have so much fun. Joey is even an ex-racer! Any of our staff who go through the training are allowed to assist with Laps for Charity.

9. *When you're not enjoying your days at the office (emphasis on enjoying!) what do you enjoy doing to relax and get away from it all?*

I am not one to relax, but I find relaxation in going on hikes in the White Mountains with friends or participating in triathlons and other running races.

10. *Are you a car person and if so, what is your favorite car and what would your dream car be?*

I will say I was not raised a "car" person, but I have many fond memories of my grandfather who was a mechanic and a big Ford guy, he loved a nice Mustang. Hmm...I have been looking into getting a SUV so not a car, but if money didn't matter a Lamborghini Urus S in orange, please!

We want to thank Danielle for taking the time to give us a brief insight into the LFC events and we look forward to the LFC 2025 season and SONHC once again returning to participate in these great events!
