

New Plants List 2026

Vegetables

Pepper *Semi Hot Hungarian Blocky*

Produces large, blocky fruit perfect for stuffing. Peppers ripen from yellow to red with a Scoville rating of 1,800 to 2,400.

Tomato *Mannon's Majesty*

This indeterminate tomato offers nice round tomatoes with great flavor and excellent split and disease resistance.

Annuals

Alternanthera *Plum Dandy*

Grown for its showy foliage, the plum purple color adds interest to any planting.

Begonia Rex *Lambada*

Showy leaves made up of different shades of pink, purple and silver, with a dark vein.

Calibrachoa *Superbells Tropical Sunrise*

Another addition to our Superbells collection, this variety features a mix of yellow and pinkish-red streaks that bloom abundantly all season long.

Coleus *Freckles, Newly Noir*

Freckles has pale yellow leaves splashed with bronze and orange. The most colorful effect of the foliage will come with partial shade. Newly Noir has deep purple to almost black foliage that does well in sunny and shady spots.

Dahlietta *Louise*

Another addition to our popular dahlia collection, this variety features pink blooms edged with white.

Grass *Cyperus King Tut*

An addition to our Baby Tut and Prince Tut grasses, King Tut can reach 4 to 6 feet tall. Adds drama to landscape or container gardens and can be used along the pond edge as it tolerates moisture well.

Petunia *Surfinia Summer Double Pink*

With extraordinary heat and rain tolerance, this double flowering Petunia will keep looking good up into fall. No deadheading necessary but we do recommend fertilizing to keep plants providing lots of color.

Supertunia *Mini Vista Pink Cloud*

Ruffled petals in shades of bright cotton candy pink with a white eye. The Mini Vista Supertunias are vigorous growers that form a full mass of eye-catching blossoms.

Perennials

Aster *Grape Crush*

Very rich, dark purple flowers are produced above dark green foliage in early to midfall. A great nectar source for pollinators when many other flowers have faded.

Dianthus *American Pie Cherry Pie*

Fragrant, deep red blooms above mounded silver foliage. Compact habit makes it ideal for containers or the front of the border.

Epimedium *Songbirds*

This variety is one of the most floriferous selections of Epimedium, producing striking golden yellow flowers in late spring. One of the few plants that can survive in dry shade.

New Plants List 2026

Geranium

New Hampshire Purple

A profusion of magenta-purple flowers atop compact, spreading mounds. The foliage turns a brilliant crimson red in the fall.

Hibiscus

Midnight Marvel

Huge red blooms glow against the rich purple foliage. The foliage color becomes more intense when planted in full sun.

Hosta

Curly Fries, Fire and Ice

Curly Fries is a small sized, chartreuse Hosta that forms an arching, wiggly clump of rippled, narrow leaves. Fire and Ice is variegated with slightly twisted leaves with white centers and green margins.

Phlox

Early Magenta

This series has the earliest bloom time of any paniculata Phlox, blooming 2-3 weeks earlier. Fragrant, magenta flowers on a compact, well branched plant.

Spigelia

Little Redhead

Super versatile perennial, can grow in either sun or shade. Dark red tubular flowers with yellow interiors are produced above dark green leaves in early summer. Avoid areas with standing water.

Nursery

Diervilla

Firefly

Vibrant amber and honey-colored foliage with bright yellow flowers bursting in late spring through summer. A great alternative for the invasive Burning Bush.

Hydrangea macrophylla *Drama Queen*

This continuously blooming beauty draws attention with bold pink flowers on a compact, tidy plant. Add acid to change the blooms to a blue color.

Hydrangea paniculata *Bubble Bath*

This petite and sturdy Hydrangea gives a full bouquet of creamy lime flowers all summer and fall. Grows 3' wide by 3' tall.

Rose

Knockout Orange Glow

Stunning, low-maintenance shrub rose that blooms repeatedly from spring to frost. This variety has luminous orange blooms with yellow and pink undertones.
