

# New Plants List 2020

## Vegetables

Pepper *Poblano*

Mild chili pepper perfect for stuffing, often roasted and peeled when cooking with them. Scoville Heat Unit: 1000-2000

## Annuals

Alstroemeria *Inca Miss Zoe*

Blooming from spring until fall, this new Alstroemeria has variegated leaves and red-orange flowers.

Caladium *Carolyn Whorton*

Another colorful variety to brighten up any shady spot. The dark green leaves are splashed in lipstick pink and have bright red midribs.

Superbells *Double Orange, Blackcurrant Punch*

Two new additions to our Proven Winners collection of Callies. Double Orange has smaller double blooms and the Blackcurrant Punch features a deep-black eye and a bright purple edge.

Coleus *Wicked Witch*

A new addition to our Coleus collection. Wicked Witch is a deep burgundy to chocolate color with ruffled edges outlined in chartreuse.

Grass *Cyperus Prince Tut*

Prince Tut is a taller version of Baby Tut, reaching to about 18-30" tall.

Lantana *Luscious Goldengate*

Golden yellow flowers cover this new Proven Winners variety. Like all other Lantana, this variety is extremely heat and drought tolerant.

## Perennials

Astrantia *Star of Billions*

A white flowering variety of Astrantia.

Baptisia *Twilite Praireblues*

A hybrid of Baptisia that features violet-purple flowers with yellow keels. This Baptisia gets 3 to 5 feet tall and a mature spread of 5 feet wide.

Bergenia *Dragonfly Sakura*

The Dragonfly Series of Bergenia features profuse blooms and compact glossy foliage that turns a dark purple in winter. Sakura produces pink, semi-double flowers.

Clematis *Asao, Mrs. Cholmondeley, Nubia*

Three new additions to our selection of Clematis. Asao is one of the earliest large-flowered varieties to bloom, producing masses of bright pink blooms. Blooming abundantly from late spring until autumn, Mrs. Cholmondeley, features large lavender-blue flowers. Nubia is a reblooming, compact Clematis with dark red blooms.

Delosperma *Jewel of Desert Ruby, Fire Spinner*

Two new Ice Plant varieties to replace our older selections. Jewel of Desert Ruby has blossoms that are a mix of ruby red tips with a central white eye and a golden halo in between. Fire Spinner features stunning tricolored flowers of orange, red and lavender.

# New Plants List 2020

Delphinium                      *Aurora Lavender, Magic Fountain Dark Blue*

The Aurora series offers excellent uniformity and vigor with sturdy stems. The Magic Fountain series is a dwarf form that does not require staking.

Echinacea                      *Green Twister*

This new selection of Coneflower offers a unique color combination. The outer edge of the petals are yellow-green and bleed into a pale, lilac -pink in the center. As the blooms mature, the colors darken to a rich carmine color.

Hemerocallis                      *Joan Senior, Monterey Jack, Primal Scream, Raspberry Eclipse, Scottish Fantasy*

We have five new colors to add to our collection of Daylilies. Joan Senior an early summer bloomer with creamy white flowers. Monterey Jack has large ruffled light-yellow flowers with a raspberry colored eye. A Proven Winners variety, Primal Scream, will give you that Wow! factor, with large, bright orange blooms. The extremely showy flowers of the Raspberry Eclipse variety feature raspberry purple blooms with heavily ruffled edges that are a lemon-yellow color. Scottish Fantasy, a reblooming variety, has large coral pink flowers.

Heuchera                      *Peach Parfait, Midnight Rose*

Two new varieties to add to our collection of Heucheras. Peach Parfait has leaves of peach and red hues with peachy orange veining. Midnight Rose features shiny, pink spotted black leaves that lighten to a cream color as the season progresses.

Heucherella                      *Pink Revolution*

Replacement for Pink Fizz. This new variety produces an extreme amount of bubblegum pink flowers in late spring.

Hibiscus                      *Starry Starry Night*

Huge 8-inch pink twirled flowers cover the dark, near black foliage of this hardy Hibiscus.

Monarda                      *Marje Purple*

Marje Monarda was bred for compact habit and mildew tolerance. This variety bloom earlier than other Monarda.

Paeonia                      *Dr. Alexander Fleming*

This Peony, known for its sweet fragrance, has large, bright pink flowers that fade to a lighter pink towards the edges.

Phlox                      *Early Pink Candy*

This series has the earliest bloom time of any paniculata Phlox, it will bloom 2-3 weeks earlier than other types.

Pulmonaria                      *Pretty in Pink*

Large, vibrant, rose-pink flowers appear in large clusters with foliage lightly speckled with silver.

Rudbeckia                      *Prairie Sun*

An All-American Selection Winner, this Rudbeckia produces large, daisy-like flowers featuring orange rays tipped with lemon yellow.

Sedum                      *Lime Zinger*

Hardy, compact cultivar with small lime-green leaves with bright cherry red edges. Produces soft pink flowers in late summer.
