***ANWEL ANTI DOPING POLICY***

## **OUR OBJECTIVE**

The primary objective of ANWEL is to develop and operate a sport that is entirely free of prohibited substances and methods in our participants and horses. We want a clean sport that is safe for all participants and our horses.

## **OUR POLICY**

Any doping in working equitation will not be tolerated. We have a zero-tolerance policy. All participants in our sport are responsible for any substances or methods used by them or their horse if such substances or methods are in breach of the World Anti-Doping Code 2015 (with 2018 amendments) as adopted by the World Anti-Doping Agency (**WADA**) with effect from 1 April 2018.

The spirit of sport is the celebration of the human spirit, body and mind and is reflected in principles of ethics, fair play and honesty which we strive to make the centrepiece of our sport. Our sport also involves a celebration of the spirit, body and mind of our horses.

For these reasons the Board of Directors of ANWEL have agreed to adopt the World Anti-Doping Code 2015 (with 2018 amendments) (**the WADA Code**) to all activities associated with working equitation. A copy of the WADA Code can be found on the ANWEL Website.

## **BREACHES**

Any breaches of the WADA Code by participants involved in working equitation in Australia will be subject to serious sanctions. They and any horses which are found to have

breached the WADA Code will not be able to compete in any competition or event sanctioned by ANWEL, any ANWE State Association or any affiliated Clubs for a minimum period of twelve (12) months or such longer period determined by the Board of Directors of ANWEL.
