The Board of ANWEL has resolved to adopt the following sections of the EA National Dressage Rules and any variations and amendments to them from time to time (which can be found at <http://www.equestrian.org.au/Dressage-rules>) which will apply in connection with all competitions, events, clinics, training days and judges' seminars conducted by any of ANWEL, its state members ("ANWE State Organisations") or any ANWE affiliated clubs ("ANWE Clubs"):

Part 1.5 – Protests, Reports, Appeals and Yellow Warning Cards

In relation to the issue of Yellow Warning Cards in accordance with Part 1.5.1(b) these can be issued by the Chief Judge for the relevant event (after consultation with the Ground Jury if this is possible and practicable) or by the Ground Jury for that event rather than by the officials referred to in Rule 1.5.1(b) of the EA National Dressage Rules.
