Jesus has said to the apostles 'peace be with you' many times. Let's examine when and the meaning and significance

The evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" – John 20:19

Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." – John 20:21

A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" – John 20:26

Jesus Uses Peace to Address Fear, to Give Peace through Challenges AND USES Peace to Secure Purpose

When you say 'peace be with you' then you are actually saying let God's rest, comfort, wholeness, and assurance go with you in every area of your life, regardless of what is happening around you.
