Earlier in the Gospel, John records Jesus saying, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (Jn. 14:27). Jesus gives peace unlike any peace offered by and experienced in the world.
