Be Street Safe!



Walking Your Dog?
Getting in a Late/Early Run?
Kids headed to the Park?



It's great that our families can walk/bike through the neighborhood, but that means we have a lot of people walking on streets that do not have sidewalks. The speed limit is 30 MPH, but that is too fast for young families. Please slow it down and watch for people in the street.

We want to emphasize the area from 7515 East Rockwood and 7523 Plaza Lane is legally designated as a "Children Play" area, with a 20 MPH speed limit from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend. **Slow down!**

Bottom line... It is up to <u>each person</u> driving a car or walking/bicycling to Be alert, SLOW DOWN, look, listen, wear reflective clothing, and <u>teach your kids</u> to look, listen and use their eyes before their feet – especially when leaving the RRF parking lot.

Be Seen!

- ♦ Wear bright colors
- ♦ Wear reflective clothing at night
- ♦ Use the sidewalk
- ♦ If no sidewalk walk left side of the street facing traffic - bike right side of the street

Be Safe!

- ♦ Be Alert Watch for cars they may not see you
- ♦ Watch the street not the phone
- ♦ Pull the plug on the earphones

Drivers, Parents & Teenagers!



- ♦ Watch for kids who may not be watching for you
- ♦ Slow down!! 20 MPH speed limit around RRF
- ♦ Stay Alert reduce distractions
- ♦ Parents remind your kids to be Street Smart!

Political Signage – It's That Time of Year

With the general election in November, it's the perfect time to review the types of signage and allowed placement, drafted not only



to protect citizens' First Amendment rights but also address personal safety, visual clutter, etc.

While RW can and will, monitor and control what signage is placed on the public easements and common ground around and a part of Rockwood, we ask that Rockwood residents respect and abide to the covenants.

Rockwood Covenants -

J. No signs, advertisements, billboards or advertising structures of any kind may be erected or maintained on any of the Building Sites herein restricted without the consent in writing of the Board of Directors of the Association, provided, however, that permission is hereby granted for the erection and maintenance of political signs (during a reasonable time period before and after the election) ...

The Rockwood Board uses for its guidance on "reasonable time period" City of Wichita Code 24.04.045 -

City of Wichita Statute 24.04 details what is allowed where and what actions can be taken. The statute prohibits "Temporary" signs on city easements and public right-of ways, which includes Rockwood entrances and medians. Signage placed on private property must have the permission of the homeowner and may be displayed 45 days prior and two days after an election.

If you have specific concerns, please take a closer look at the statute for actions you can take. This year, as in any other election cycle, please be aware to keep any kind of political signage within your property lines.

Rockwood Trees Need TLC, too!



Rockwood's shady, tree-lined streets are some of the best attributes for our neighborhood, adding to the quality of life and the value of our properties. Diseases, lack of regular trimming/ deadwooding can damage or

destroy trees and property if not properly addressed. Insects can infect and damage whole neighborhoods of trees.

Trim and Spray to keep them healthy. After you pull into your driveway, look toward the street – and up – up into your trees in your front yard next to the street. Do you see a lot of dead wood up in the tree and over the street? Technically the trees belong to the city – but any damage caused by falling limbs, as well as the overall health of the tree, etc. – are the responsibility of the homeowner. Please call the city to get those trimmed. Use the Wichita Report App – reporting is easy.

If you have not already, please consider getting your trees sprayed for scales on a regular basis. An infestation can not only seriously damage your trees, but also those of your neighbors.

Please help protect the investment in your homes and contact your arborist of choice to schedule annual spraying, to arrange for proper trimming and to check the trees for any necessary maintenance.

TrashTalk

The dumpster in the RRF parking lot is available for your use if space is available in the dumpster.



DO NOT place items on top of or on the ground around the dumpster. *Those items are a safety hazard!*

Time to clean up our act – the container at the RRF is a great perk but, even emptied five times a week, is still often overfull and a hazard. We must do a better job of using this dumpster or risk losing it altogether. The problem is consistent, a weekly problem and the end result is the same – a dumpster that is a hazard to the RW those who monitor the trash in the dumpster and Waste Connections staff/equipment.

Please pack your trash to use the least amount of space:

- Break down your boxes
- Break/cut your limbs or boards to less than 6 feet long
- Place items all the way in the dumpster (does not go over the top or hang out the sides!!!)
- Do not leave anything on the ground

PLEASE, if it is full, bring your trash back once the dumpster has been emptied. We realize it is an inconvenience for you, but it is both a safety hazard and incurs an overage fee if the dumpster is already overfull (and risks not being emptied at all).

Please note: Do not rake leaves into the drainage/sewer system - actually against city code. Please mulch or bag. Waste Connections allows five bags per pickup

AUTO BURGLARY TIPS

- <u>NEVER</u> LEAVE VALUABLE ITEMS VISIBLE FROM
 OUTSIDE (money (even just coins), purses, wallets,
 bags/backpacks, electronic equipment –
 computers/tablets/GPS units, cell phones, checkbooks,
 briefcases, sunglasses, mail/documents, guns, etc.)
- ALWAYS LOCK YOUR VEHICLE
- PARK IN A WELL-LIT AREA, visible from a window
- DO NOT LEAVE YOUR VEHICLE RUNNING WHEN UNATTENDED
- BE ACTIVE IN A NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK WATCH

AUTO VANDALISM TIPS

- PARK IN A GARAGE OR, AT LEAST, IN THE DRIVEWAY, if a garage is not available
- ENSURE YOUR GARAGE DOOR IS CLOSED
- UTILIZE GOOD LIGHTING TO ILLUMINATE AROUND VEHICLES
- BE ACTIVE IN A NEIGHBORHOOD BLOCK WATCH
